A word from Pastor Darryl

Last Sunday was Easter Sunday, and the day kicked off with an Easter Morning Jazz Brunch with Ron Corsaro Jazz Trio. Following the Jazz Brunch we had our traditional Easter Sunday worship with the celebration of Holy Communion. It was great to see our members along with their relatives, friends and visitors in attendance to experience an uplifting time of storytelling with the children, choral singing, organ music, the sharing of the written and spoken word and fellowship with one another! It is true that "Every Sunday is Easter Sunday!" If not, it's time to make it that way! The call for us to consider inviting our relatives and friends and the "Easter Sunday crowd" to participate more fully in attendance at worship and in the life of our congregation beginning from this year's Easter Sunday, is an understanding of Jesus' Resurrection as the claim that God entered the stage of human history in order to create an entirely new reality all together. Every Sunday we recognize the incredible scope and titanic implications of the biblical witness that when God raised Jesus from the dead God was creating a new reality; overthrowing death, sin, and all that would oppress us; and declaring once and for all that *life* is more powerful than *death* and *love* more enduring that tragedy. Therefore, every Sunday we invite relatives, friends and visitors to live out this new reality that God is alive in our worship experience and in our love and service in partnership with others in our community and world! The truth is our doubts, questions, and even downright skepticism about resurrection – these aren't the opposite of faith, but rather an essential ingredient. Faith, after all, isn't knowledge. Rather, faith, as the author to the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us, "is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (11:1). Perhaps Easter Sunday – this Day of Days is as good a time as any to give God thanks for the gift of faith – the ability not to understand the mystery of the resurrection but to be inspired to hope and believe that it is true! As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship this and every Sunday!

What is the General Conference and Why Is It Important?

In May, 2016, the General Conference of The United Methodist Church will convene for a 10-day session in Portland, Oregon. The General Conference, which meets every four years, is the body that governs The United Methodist Church and approves the mission, organization, policies, agencies and The Book of Discipline – the document that guides the church in its global mission.

How is it structured? Who votes? What proposals and issues are on the agenda for the 2016 General Conference? How will the decisions of the General Conference affect the local

churches, annual conferences, and program and administrative agencies of the church in fulfilling the mission of the church "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world?"

On two Saturday mornings, April 23 and April 30, you are invited to participate in "An Overview of the 2016 General Conference. The sessions will be led by Rev. James Pollard, and meet from 9:30 am – 11:30 am on each Saturday at Christ UMC.

Session 1, on April 23, will describe the organization and process of decision-making of the General Conference, and will begin an overview of the major reports and recommendations on the agenda. You will also be invited to share in a district-wide prayer vigil for the General Conference.

Session 2, on April 30, will continue a review of the various proposals .that will be in consideration.
