Hi Everyone:

March has arrived. March brings us a month of Lent. It brings us daylight savings time (remember to spring forward this Saturday night). March brings us the vernal equinox (aka first day of spring). And, let us hope and pray, March will bring us a change in the frigid and snowy weather we've been having. March is a month of changes. The daylight gets a little longer each day. The snow will melt (it always has). The crocuses and the snow drops will eventually peak their noses up and the inexorable dance of spring will commence. I love the anticipated time and the bold expectations of change. I've been working on some other changes in my life. This Lent I have been practicing some of the classic spiritual disciplines — I say practicing because I am a long way from being good at any of them. But they are disciplines (practices, if you prefer) that shift my focus from me and mine to listening to God and being aware of what is happening in and around me. Make some space and be with God.

HERE'S A WAY TO ENHANCE YOUR BIBLE READING: Try keeping a Journal. Sometimes, when you are reading, something in the reading will speak to you or stand out to you. Take a moment and write down the SCRIPTURE. Then make an OBSERVATION (what spoke to me??). Thirdly, ask "How would I APPLY this to my life. Finally, make what you learned into a PRAYER. This method of bible reading is called the S.O.A.P. method and allows us to ask "how will I be different because of what I just read?"

Parting Thought

I ran across this quote from E. Stanley Jones about listening to the voice of God in our lives: "God cannot guide you in any way that is not Christ-like. Jesus was supreme sanity. There was nothing psychopathic about Him. He went off into no visions, no dreams. He got His guidance through prayer as you and I do. That is, He got His guidance when in control of His faculties, and not when out of control as in dreams. I do not say that God may not guide through a vision or dream; but if He does, it will be very seldom, and it

will be because He cannot get hold of our normal processes to guide them. For God is found most clearly and beneficially in the normal rather than the abnormal. And Jesus is the Normal, for he is the Norm." (E. Stanley Jones, *The Way*. Nashville: Abingdon/Cokesbury, 1946, p. 283.) We often think that God only speaks to us in the thunder and dramatic circumstances but the Biblical and experiential reality is much simpler and much more mundane. God speaks to us through the still small voice; in the breathing whisper; in the sudden "AHA!" while reading the Bible; in the challenge and support of friends; in other words, in the day to day. This Sunday is the 42nd anniversary of my conversion into a Christ-follower. Although my moment of change was fairly radical and dramatic, the reality of walking with God since then has been the slow and certain process of listening, remembering, and living into God's direction and voice in the daily disciplines and routines of a Christ follower's life. One denomination has as its promotional slogan "God is still speaking." I would challenge that statement by simply asking: who said God ever stopped? God is still speaking; the problem has been: are we listening?
