A Word From Pastor Daven

There was a pastor who, as he led the congregation he served into Lent, during children's time during the first Sunday of Lent, he began a dialogue with them. His primary question to the children was if any of them could tell him what Lent is. An eight-year-old raised his hand and said, "yes, it's what we get out of our pockets."

In a sense, it is that stuff that we get out of our lives—the dust, the crud. We dig it out and throw it out. For us to get anything out of Lent, however, requires us to take it seriously. We take on fasts not just as a dietary measure, but in order to explore life, since food is means of life. The intent of Lent is to make us ask- what does life mean? On what does my life depend? As we hunger physically from our Lenten fasts, only then can we begin to come to a place of spiritual hunger for the source of real sustenance.

We live in a contentious time. It even has become difficult to discuss challenging issues within families and between close neighbors. How can we live as peacemakers when we can't even talk with one another?

The book, <u>The Anatomy of Peace: Resolving the Heart of Conflict</u>, written by once-bitter enemies, explores how to transform personal, professional, and global conflicts by asking several questions:

- What if conflicts at home, at work, and conflicts in the world stem from the same root cause?
 - What if we systematically misunderstand that cause?
- And what if, as a result, we systematically perpetuate the very problems we think we are trying to solve?

Living with a heart of peace is a spiritual discipline that has practical results. Through the

Lenten season, share in reading, reflection and conversation as we seek to be peacemakers in a contentious time.
