#### A word from Pastor Darryl

Last Sunday we continued our Lenten journey toward the celebration of Easter Day reflecting on the passage of Luke 15:1-3 & 11b-32 with the question "What If God Were the Prodigal Son?" The challenge for us lies in being open and ready to discover newness in this familiar story. If we think we already know what the story is about, or think that it only means a couple of things, then we close ourselves off to its depth. It is difficult for us to see something new in the parable of the Prodigal Son. We have heard the story so many times we believe that we have squeezed it dry of meaning. So here are some questions to consider this week in your personal devotional time: what if God were the prodigal son in this story? How might we twist the kaleidoscope (scenes/images in the story) to allow ourselves to see the story's pieces arranged in different ways, so we might experience its power even more greatly? Chances are, we already connect to this parable in meaningful ways. So, what opportunities are offered for us to build on that preexisting relationship and acknowledge its importance? What if God is the God who comes to us in the disguise of those we despise, those who have hated and killed us, rejected us and abandoned us, those who annoy and frustrate us most, and those who are excluded? In the disguise of the sinner, the debauched, the prostitute, the unclean, the enemy, the unsavory, and God comes to us and challenges us to participate in a radical, irresponsible hospitality that turns the rules of polite society upside-down. And if God comes to us as this, how do we respond? As the father does, subverting social norms and opening his life to the chaos the prodigal brings? Or as the brother does, maintaining society's values but closing off his life to loving the 'other'? In this parable, Jesus is asking us whether we will entertain angels/strangers, even if the angels/strangers look to us like demons, like exactly what we fear and detest. Jesus is asking us whether we can overcome our prejudice and the oppression of religious legal doctrine/dogma to open our arms enough to embrace the 'other,' the other who is

actually our closest kin. Jesus once said that if we have seen "the thirsty, the oppressed, the imprisoned, the lame, the blind, the abused, the neglected, then, we have truly seen him." Jesus told this story to make several points, but surely one of them was to say something about the nature of God. People ask the question: what is God like? The simplest and clearest answer is given in the story of the Prodigal Son. God is love, and God rejoices when we repent and turn to God. The word repent has within it the idea of turning, or returning – in this case returning home to reestablish a relationship with a parent. If someone asks the question, "What must I do to be saved?" The most common answer given is "Be good." But this is not what Jesus is saying in this story. His answer is not "Be good," but cry "Help!" People often feel that they must first clean up their acts, and then they can come to church. But Jesus reverses this. He is saying, first come and reestablish your relationship with God, and everything else will follow. As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship!
