Parting Thought:

One of the great challenges in cross cultural relationships is attempting to see the world through the experience and eyes of the other while at the same time helping them to see the world through your eyes. I have found that this process and experience has made me a better student of the Bible and, I hope, a more compassionate pastor and leader. This past week with my friend Rev. Davis Matovu was eye opening for both of us. We who live in North America live in a culture of options and choices. I took Davis to Wegman's and attempted to explain the economics of a grocery super store. We walked around the store. How many different types of pasta, breakfast cereal, cat food, paper products, and soups does a person need? We live in a society where we expect options and we have been well trained to be "good consumers" in our consumer goods driven economy. Life in Uganda is very different. Yes there are grocery stores (none at all like Wegman's). The large grocery in Kampala caters to expatriate Westerners. Most Ugandans purchase food from the many large open air markets and dry goods from much smaller groceries in the various business centers. I have become increasingly aware of what our "got to have options" does to our worshipping life. We become spiritual consumers and many Americans journey from church to church looking for that perfect and comfortable blend of music we like and preaching that is engaging but doesn't challenge us all that much and where there is lots of stuff for the kids and too many of us move from place to place never getting past our own needs and desires – and never experiencing the joy of life in authentic community. It is not spiritual consumption that transforms lives it is spiritual surrender. The moment I surrender the idea that life (and the spiritual life) is all about me and my needs and my wants and my preferences the possibility exists for me to move deeper in my spiritual journey. But, as I said, this is difficult in our consumer mentality society. Seeing our culture through the eyes of my friend helps me see

the blind spots and the assumptions that can be problematic. I am blessed to have him as my friend.
