I am excited about our first Confirmation together. I believe that the Christian faith is something that must be chosen. At some point in our lives, at some moment along the journey we need to make a conscious choice to be a Christ follower (or not). The importance of this choice is often lost in the cultural Christianity that surrounds us. We often do things like baptism and confirmation because it is what we are supposed to do at a certain age and season. Although this is a great way to have us connected to the church it can leave us lost in the ritual formalism of the event and we miss the point that a critical choice is being made. We go through the ritual and miss the vital relationship that is the heart of the Christian faith. At a baptism parents are making promises and making a choice to raise this child as a Christian. At Confirmation our young people are publically affirming and confirming for themselves those choices and promises their parents made for them when the were baptized. It is an important moment and a vital decision. We don't become Christ followers by accident or by osmosis. It is a life that we choose. I am praying, and I invite all of you to join with me in praying for Brandon and Leanne as they publically choose to be followers of Christ.
