Weekly Update: May 31, 2016

A Word From Pastor Darryl

This past Sunday we concluded our sermon series entitled "Reclaiming Our Wesleyan Vitality." Our sub-theme was "The Warmed Heart – The Need for Assurance." I posed these questions to the gathered community: which of the following questions do you consider to be the most basic religious questions of life? Does God exist? Does God care about me? Is Jesus Christ really the only Savior of the World? How can I be sure of my relationship with God? Is death the end? What must I do to be saved? What is the true meaning of life? The conclusion I drew from these questions is that the most basic religious question for people is not, "Does God exist?" God's existence is taken for granted by most people, and there is no need for theoretical proof of this. The primary religious question therefore is, "How can I be **sure** of my faith, **sure** of my relationship with God?" People generally can cope with disease, disappointment, disillusionment, and even death, but beyond the tragedies of human existence, we want an assurance of divine acceptance – how can we be certain that we are forgiven and acceptable to God? Despite of all our shortcomings, failures, and selfishness, how can we be sure that there are no longer barriers to divine fellowship with God? There is an inherent need for assurance and God has given us this assurance of our faith and salvation in Jesus Christ. It is a central teaching, one of the major emphases of our United Methodist Church, beginning with John Wesley's heart-warming experience at Aldersgate Street in London England. But long before Wesley, the apostles had an assurance of their faith and salvation in Jesus Christ. We see it in the letter of Paul to Timothy – an unashamed confidence in Jesus Christ: "...I am not ashamed, for I know in whom I have believed, and I am sure that he will keep me until that day what has been entrusted to me." (2Tim. 1:12)

How can I be sure of my faith, sure of my relationship with God? We know that when someone becomes a Christian, God's Holy Spirit lives within that person. The Holy Spirit enables us to be sure of our faith in Christ. The Spirit transforms us from within and produces the character of Jesus in our lives. This is called "the fruit of the Spirit": *love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.* (Gal. 5:22-23) So when the Holy Spirit lives within us this fruit begins to grow. Our character changes and that light often shines on others – evidence of the Spirit's witness – we grow in God's grace, a life-long process of pruning, and nurturing, and growing. We hope by God's grace that over time other people will see that we are more loving, more joyful, more peaceful, more patient, kinder, more self-controlled and more God-controlled. Our attitude toward others changes and we have a renewed concern for people we meet – in the street, at the coffee shop or grocery store, at the office or in other places having had that inner experience of God who creates a deep, personal conviction that we are children of God! We are offered the assurance – the blessed assurance of a warmed heart – Expect it! Seek it! Experience it! Share it! As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship this Sunday!
