## Hi Everyone:

Thank you for your prayers and encouragement while I was on retreat with my covenant group last week. 17 . <u>A Biblical and Theological Primer</u>, written by Dr. B.J. Norrix is in the translation phase of its publication. This book was written for the Nexus Seminary students in Uganda and will be printed in English and Lugandan. We are planning to distribute the first copies of this book in October 2012. The total cost to publish the first 2000 copies of this book will be around 5-6,000 US dollars. Rev. Davis Matovu has also written a commentary on the Book of Revelation that we will be publishing as well. Total Cost of both projects is 8-10,000.

Biblical Resources in Lugandan are nonexistent. There is a Lugandan translation of the Bible that we provide for our graduates but actual Bible study materials do not exist. There is a deep need for more and better materials in the native language (Lugandan). Rev. Matovu and Dr. BJ wrote their documents to respond to this need. We are hoping that these will be the first of many resources developed for the rural pastor in Uganda.

- 19. There are now **6** of us officially signed up for the Israel 2013 journey. The tour is 10 days: we spend 3 days in the Galilee in and around the sea; we spend four days in and around Jerusalem, Bethlehem, etc. We will visit Jericho and the Dead Sea and walk the via Dolorosa. **We depart on January 28, 2013.** If you would like to join us see the Church office or Pastor BJ for brochure and more information. All Inclusive cost is \$2598 (transportation from New York; deluxe hotel accommodations; breakfast and dinner ground transportation, guide, deluxe motor coach and all entrance fees).

This will be my 5<sup>th</sup> journey to the Holy Land. Each trip I discover something new to illuminate my understanding of the Bible (Old and New) and the background needed for understanding.

United Methodist General Conference concluded in Tampa, Florida Friday, May 4, 2012. Historically, General Conference has almost always supported and maintained the status quo. This General Conference followed its historical trajectory. There were no earth shaking or significant decisions made at General Conference. A mild restructuring plan that will down size some of the National Boards and Agencies was approved in the last few hours of the Conference. The General Conference voted to eliminate "guaranteed appointment" for United Methodist Elders but a judicial ruling will be made on its constitutionality in the Fall. The church made no changes on its stance regarding homosexuality (ordination or marriages). The discipline continues to read "homosexuality is not compatible with Christian teaching." I have come to believe that keeping this provision in the discipline is harmful and exclusionary because it singles out one behavior (regardless of how one feels about homosexuality) over a wide range of other behaviors. We could just as easily say adultery or greed or hording or a thousand other things are "incompatible with Christian teaching" but we don't and I believe it is unjust and unfair to single out one behavior over all others. Perhaps we do this because we don't really want to deal with the underlying malaise of our national church. We are a denomination that has lost 1/3 of its members and regular attendees since 1968. We seem unwilling and unable to deal with this trend or even to acknowledge that it is a problem on the national stage. General Conference also revealed what we already know to be true about our country and our denomination. We are badly divided. The debate on most of these issues continues to arise from what appear to be mutually exclusive presuppositions and very different hermeneutics. The extreme wings of the church (and our nation) not only appear unlikely to ever agree, but appear to be speaking in different languages. My good friend Aaron Bouwens in his blog called watching this event like watching "a slow motion train wreck".

What does all this mean for Christ Church, Snyder? It means we continue to strive to live our lives faithful to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It means we continue to make room for everyone and anyone seeking the grace and mercy of God. It means we continue to do all we can to bring heaven to earth and to make a difference for Jesus sake wherever we find ourselves. The hope for the national church is that local churches like ours will catch the fire of the Holy Spirit and move forward in new and life giving ways.
