A Word From Pastor Darryl

I share with you a joy that I had this past weekend in honor of our country's veterans. As the District Superintendent of Crossroads District I helped lead the district in raising \$16,000 to acquire a van (photo attached to email) for use by veterans for transportation to health centers around Central NY. The idea came from the District United Methodist Men's group and during the Charge Conference season of 2014 we encouraged each congregation to give a minimum of \$200 to meet our goal. This campaign ended in March of 2015 and last weekend in Syracuse, the Ford Motor Company, who contributed the remainder of the funds, presented the van to The United Methodist Church of Crossroads District. I wasn't able to attend, however, Bishop Mark Webb and DS Nola Anderson along with the UMM, veterans and other state and community leaders were present for this very special occasion. It is a great joy to see this project come to fruition for women and men who serve our country with loyalty, true dedication and service. There is still so much that needs to be offered to our veterans especially in terms of health care and other basic needs for their families. Veterans Day - Wednesday, November 11

This past Sunday we continued our sermon series on "Reclaiming" Our Wesleyan Vitality," with the sub-topic "Re-Introducing the Wesleys." We will continue with Part 2 of that sub-topic this coming Sunday. John and Charles Wesley demonstrated their fervent desire for people to become committed disciples of Jesus Christ. Their teachings and practice of faith have relevance for those who desire to live faithfully in today's culture. However, it is evident that, within our churches generally, there is a lack of understanding about Wesleyan theology. Even people from our own Methodist tradition are largely uninformed about Wesley's "Way of Salvation." Our aim in this sermon series (as we continue here in November and then at various times in 2016) is to help us understand and apply Wesley's teachings to our lives, especially his Way of Salvation. The Way of Salvation is a spiritual road map of the journey of humanity toward God – a pathway of grace – in which we respond to God with increasing self-awareness of our separation from God (and other people), and our consequent need to come back home to God. This spiritual foundation in Wesleyan theology is needed in order for our congregation to be motivated once again by the early Methodist mission to "spread Scriptural holiness over the land." It is also needed so that our members will be empowered to pursue Wesley's Biblically grounded goal of being renewed in God's image. Through this series, we pray that as individuals, and as a church community, we will be energized by the Holy Spirit to be transformed from being "almost Christians" to being "altogether Christians." As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship!
