We've been hearing the news recently about the troubled healthcare website making it difficult for people to sign up themselves and their families for insurance. The people who didn't support the affordable Healthcare Act in the first place are there to say, "See, I told you it wouldn't work." While others are just plain disappointed that something that showed real promise to make a difference is taking so long to show positive results. Still others are confused and dismayed that such a great country can't seem to find a way to take care of it's people in the margins while sorting out the ever present forces that subvert and corrupt the integrity of our best intentions. It always feels like we're climbing a mountain.

This morning's news brought the story of three men in their 20's who managed to get a website up and running using the same public information the government uses in their website and, just as originally stated in the planning stage for the ACA, people are signing up for their healthcare in a matter of minutes. Why can three 20-somethings accomplish in minutes what all the government resources cannot do? I'll leave that question to your consideration today......
