Seeing Your Breath

I stepped out into the cold this morning to walk my daughter to the end of the driveway where I see her off to the bus. Being garbage morning, I went in advance of her to wheel out our totes for collection. As I took my first step out of the door before I set about my tasks, I was struck with my first inhalation of the chilled air which stopped me in my tracks.

Holding it in for a moment, I then let it go in a burst where it caught in the windless morning, my breath condensing into a cloud of frozen vapor. I then repeated this several times watching the vapor slowly rising with the dawn. Watch kids at a bus stop on such a morning and you will see the simple joy they derive from this experience. Somewhere along the way we are so busy with garbage totes and schedules we lose the mystery of simply being able to see our breath.



Such mornings and moments provide spiritual clarity. The Bible is filled with times and teachings about the nearness of God, as close as and in our very breathing. Maybe we dismiss it because we can't see it or it takes the quiet focus of meditation for which we have

neither the time nor the patience. But on these cold mornings, we can't miss it. God is right there, reminding us, encouraging us with the very breath of life. Just as our breath turns to a solid, the evidence of God's presence becomes visible and solid right before our eyes. -Pastor Daven
