# A Word From Pastor Darryl

This past Sunday we continued our sermon series on *"Reclaiming Our Wesleyan Vitality,"* with the sub-topic *"Re-Introducing the Wesleys."* Over the past few weeks we have been engaged in a little bit of a quick history lesson with some biblical and theological reflections about the Wesleys. We continue to unlock the major shifts in the lives of the Wesley brothers, particularly John Wesley. When confronted with a group of Moravians who had such peace during a life-threatening experience, Wesley realized that his faith was lacking. While he believed that Jesus was the *savior of the world*, he did not **know** Jesus Christ to be his *personal savior*. He did not know that Christ died for him. He lacked what others would call "assurance." As he made progress toward Christian discipleship he had to take a few steps backward to gain perspective on his life. Wesley later was himself inspired to write for the church a doctrine of Christian

Assurance. Wesley began meeting with a Moravian minister named Peter Bohler. He had many conversations with Bohler and others about salvation by faith. Can you think of people in your life, that one person who has encouraged you to grow in your faith? Perhaps still encourages you today, or could you find someone with whom you can have that friendship of faith? I am encouraging us also to find that faith partner to mentor us spiritually – No one is an island; No one stands alone. Each one's joy is joy to me, each one's grief is my own...We need one another...John Wesley had Peter Bohler and Peter Bohler had John Wesley as a faith partner. It was another major turning point in Wesley's life. Another crucial change became visible in Wesley's approach to ministry after his experience of assurance. Before his Aldersgate experience, Wesley was very concerned with order and ceremony, sometimes to a fault. Everything had to be straight-laced, no changing of anything, strictly formal and rigid. Afterwards, he increasingly became open to the ways that God seemed to be working. If the Holy Spirit was doing something in his midst, Wesley wanted to cooperate with it rather than be an obstacle to it. That's the Methodist church we know and love and that once had the vitality that we're called upon to reclaim. A Methodist church that is open to the Holy Spirit's leading, that is not rigid, that is not overly formal, and open to change when needed. If John was the intellectual force of Methodism, Charles was the one who helped the "head knowledge" become the "heart knowledge" of Methodism. We give God thanks for God's hand rested upon these two brothers, and offered them the assurance of salvation through the richness of God's amazing grace. As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship!
