Hi Everyone:

On this past Sunday (November 16) as part of my Stewardship of Resources sermon, I laid down a challenge to the members and friends of Christ UMC. Over the past several years we have played with a \$20-30K gap between our anticipated income and our anticipated expenses. The primary result of the gap is that we have not been sending 100% of our "Shared Ministries" to the Annual Conference. These "Shared Ministries" funds are vitally important. They pay for the church camps, and our District Superintendent, they pay for national and international missionaries and our Bishop, they pay for training programs like Hand2Plow and Living Well. These funds are the glue that holds the connection together and represent our "fair share" of being United Methodists in Upper New York. I challenged the members and friends of Christ Church to "step up". There are things we need to do but cannot because we are handicapped by this budget gap. I would like to hire a part time youth pastor. We need to increase our

mission foot print. We need to take better care of our staff – but cannot do much because of the gap. When you break \$30,000 down by 120 regular giving units it comes out to shortfall of \$250 a year, or about \$5 a week. I challenged every member of the congregation to step up that extra \$5 – which, though I am already tithing (giving 10+% of my salary to Jesus Christ through the ministry of Christ Church), I agreed to do as well.

I am deeply blessed by so many of you who answered the challenge – and several of you who stepped up, over and above, the \$5 challenge. We'll see what the final numbers show but I am convinced that those of you who stepped up will be deeply blessed (as God promises). There is still time. Let Doris Schanzlin know that you are meeting the challenge and "stepping up" with that plus \$5 (or more if you can). Let's get this done! I am already celebrating your faithfulness!

Parting Thoughts:

I'm always somewhat stunned by the first significant snowfall of the season. I find myself stunned by two things. First, the treacherous beauty of any significant snow event. I sat in dazed amazement as I looked out the window of the train on Monday and saw the glistening snow covered trees along the tracks – it was spectacular. I watched, and prayed, as I saw news clips of people stranded on the Thruway (including the entire Niagara University Women's basketball team) in a blinding snowstorm (treacherous, indeed). I have been offering prayers for the first responders (police and fire) who are

providing critical assistance for those stuck in the elements. The other stunning thing is people's responses and reactions. After all here in the Buffalo area it does this every year and yet many people seem angry or disappointed or just seem to have completely forgotten how it all works. There is a spiritual need in each of us to learn to take life as it comes. All too often we are stuck in the past or lost in the future and we miss the beauty and wonder of the moment. All too often we get overwhelmed by unrealistic expectations - maybe it WON'T snow this year? Maybe the Bills will make it back to the playoffs this year? Maybe at Thanksgiving dinner Uncle (fill in the blank) won't get drunk this year? Unrealistic expectations? Perhaps. OK, some maybe, NOT all are unrealistic but a snow storm from Mid November to Mid March should not come as any kind of huge surprise. There is an expression (actually it is an expression I am learning to not like) that says "it is what it is." But the truth is so much of life simply is what it is and railing against the machines or railing against the fickleness of weather patterns won't change a thing. Maybe we should do what the kids do when it might snow (and maybe, just maybe, they'll get a snow day). They go to bed with their pajamas on inside out in hopes that they'll get that bonus day off. What could be better than hunkering down at home with a hot beverage and a good book or movie or just playing some games with family and friends? You can't change it. You can leave it (and many do) or you can learn to love it (and most of us do). Either way it is what it is . . .
