## Parting Thought:

Sunday marks the beginning of the season of Advent. The Christmas creep (no that is not a reference to someone's neighbor) has decorations going up in early November and the "music" of the season beginning right after Halloween. There is big push to have a "Christmas Season" that is often called the "Holiday Season" in deference to the various other dates (Thanksgiving and New Year) and other mid winter observances (Hanukah, Kwanza, Solstice, etc.) that are observed in the month of December. The early Christian practice was to not allow Christmas to creep into the month but to hold off the celebration until the date had arrived. If we are celebrating the birth of Jesus it seems premature to celebrate it before the actual event -Although I would love a 60 build up to my birthday every year it never happens. The Church invented the season of Advent as a season of spiritual preparation. The arrival of the Christ child is the turning point of history. We need to take time to get ready for the momentous occasion. Getting ready may involve more quite time, a day or two of fasting, getting reacquainted with the biblical account of the story of the coming of Christ and considering the impact of the Christ in the world and our lives. With all the push to buy, buy, buy and the giving and receiving of gifts we are often confused as to whose birthday we are celebrating (see AOL study above). Advent is a season of preparation and anticipation. It is a time to not just dress our hearths and homes but to address the state of our hearts and lives. How is it with your soul? Anticipation is expressed in this A. A. Milne quote from Winnie the Pooh: "Well," said Pooh, "what I like best," and then he had to stop and think because although Eating Honey was a very good thing to do, there was a moment just before you began to eat it which was better than when you were, but he didn't know what it was called." Advent is to be that moment . . . just before.
