A word from Pastor Darryl -

This past Sunday was All Saints Day and our congregation paid tribute to our members and to loved ones and friends of Christ church who passed away during the

last year. This is always a meaningful moment to pause, reflect on those who have gone on triumphantly to the Lord (as the writer in the Letter to the Hebrews proclaimed), "...pioneers blazing who blazed the way..." (Heb.12:1). As we began a sermon series on Sunday for this month of November on "Reclaiming Our Weslevan" Vitality, "we also used as a beginning point the remembrance of the last years and days of John Wesley, the founder (the pioneer) of the Wesleyan tradition of which forms our heritage as The United Methodist Church. One of the captivating and memorable lines of Wesley in his last moment as a "saint" of Jesus Christ are these words, "the best of all is God is with us." These words provided the blessed assurance to Wesley himself and to the company of believers (nicknamed *Methodists*) in the movement for Christ, that being satisfied with the continual conviction that in Christ they were justified by faith, and then went on to full sanctification. Up to his very last moment Wesley mustered up the strength to sing. He broke out singing with such vigor that all his friends were astonished — "I'll praise my Maker while I've breath; And when my voice is lost in death; Praise shall employ my nobler powers; My days of praise shall ne'er be past; While life, and thought, and being last; Or immortality endures; Happy the man whose hopes rely; On Israel's God: He made the sky; And earth and seas, with all their train; His truth for ever stands secure, He saves the oppressed, He feeds the poor; And none shall find His promise vain." (Isaac Watts) This is the Methodism we know and love, and therefore must reclaim its vitality for the sake of Christ to help transform the world! So, over the next three (3) weeks and continuing at various months in the coming year, we will share this theme of "Reclaiming Our Wesleyan Vitality." We will discover the life-changing riches of the theology and spirituality of our Wesleyan tradition through the lens of John and Charles Wesley that will help the church equip us to live out the mission to "make disciples of Jesus Christ."

We offer our thanks to you for the pledges we have received this past Sunday. For our members who have not been able to offer your pledge on Sunday, we strongly encourage you to do so this week. Our Stewardship and Finance Team is working with a deadline of no later than November 10 to put the 2016 Ministry Plan in place.
