Meeting on Saturday, Nov. 5, the Planning Team for our consultation process developed a draft purpose statement for Christ UMC. The draft statement is based on the discussions and outcome of the Oct. 29 retreat day.

The draft statement is: **The purpose of Christ UMC is to grow living networks of faith and service connecting home, church and community.**

The next step in the process takes place in small focus groups in which all members and friends of the church are invited to participate and share their responses to the draft statement. Each focus group will be led by a member of the Planning Team, and a Planning Team member will serve as recorder for the meeting. Following the focus group gatherings, the Planning Team will meet to prepare the final version of the purpose statement. Based on the purpose statement, we will then begin developing a strategic plan for the next steps in the ministry of Christ Church.


