

With Joy . . . From Sally

November: Thanksgiving Day, harvest time for enjoying apples and squash, awareness of blessings, gratitude for gifts... Maybe your list is similar. It's meaningful and necessary for us to consider all that we've been given. If we reflect honestly we may find ourselves

overwhelmed by all that is ours.

When we're talking gifts, none of these things has been earned. By definition all gifts are given freely. God has been very generous. God is lavish in love, generous in goodness, even Jesus is a free gift to us. God's generosity draws us to look at our own generosity: How generous have we been? Are we people who give freely of our treasures? Do we long to follow God's example of giving freely? These are good questions, but here's a question that caused me to think about generosity in a new way...What is the point at which a person becomes generous?

After pondering and searching through books and articles, here's what I found. A list of ten ways to become a more generous person included considering the report that generous people are happier, healthier, and more satisfied with life than those who don't give. It went on to suggest making a list of things for which you are grateful, considering what passions move you, and becoming involved alongside someone that you admire in something they support. While these suggestions don't answer the question regarding the point at which one becomes generous, they demonstrate that while generosity is typically seen as the opposite of self-serving, considering the personal benefits can be an important step to becoming generous.

One thing seems clear. Generosity doesn't happen by chance. A "wait and see what's left over after we care for ourselves" approach doesn't make us generous. The problem is that most of the time there's nothing left over... no time, no energy, no money, no interest, etc. Generosity is the result of an intentional decision that we make in our lives. One blogger said it this way, "...generosity is the new decluttering. It's what happens next in a life that's so much more interesting than an average one." So, what is the point at which a person becomes generous? It's that moment when we decide we're capable of making a difference in the world and start addressing the needs of others around us. In doing so, we help shape our community into a healthier one.



FROM BJ'S DESK...



In November our ancestors marked with a great feast and celebration the end of harvest and the acknowledgement that enough food had been grown, preserved, and stored to last us until the first fruits of spring and the next harvest. This celebration is marked in most countries and

religions with great feasting. It was important to feast and celebrate because if we go back just a generation or two, our families survived from harvest to harvest. One bad growing season could spell a very lean winter and, perhaps, even starvation. Thus, the awareness that we would survive another winter had to be marked in this way. The celebration would involve copious amounts of food: huge birds, roasted meats, vegetables, and bakery items, both practical and frivolous. We call this event "Thanksgiving."

The focus of Thanksgiving was the awareness of God's generosity and bounty. We would pause in our great feasting, hold hands, and somberly give thanks to God for our lives and the means to survive. Then, let the party begin, because celebration is also a central Christian discipline. For the Christian, the word "Thanksgiving" in the Greek is "eucharista", which literally means "to give thanks." We call Communion "Eucharist" because at the heart of the sharing of the bread and the cup is a prayer thanking God for all that God has done for us through Jesus Christ.

For many years I have tried to combine these two events with a gathering on the Wednesday before Thanksgiving (this year November 21) with a quiet service of communion and a time to express our thanks to God for the life and bounty we enjoy. Join me on Wednesday, November 21 at 7:00 for a vespers service of thanksgiving here at Christ Church.

Finally, on behalf of John Miller and Kathryn Weaver (and Esther Keeney and Clair Mosher,) we want to thank you for the prayers and encouragement on our recent Uganda mission. We were overwhelmed by your support and upheld by your prayers and we are thankful. We will take time as we move forward to share our stories and photos and experiences with all of you. Kathy and John (and Esther Keeney) served between 1200 and 1500 persons through various clinics over 6 events. I was overwhelmingly proud of our team and the hard and dedicated work they accomplished.

We've been able to keep the church in business by paying our bills, but at this writing, there is \$2,926.00 in our account to meet current bills and payroll!

We've been able to pay the offerings designated monthly for World Service, but the Conference is on a calendar year and the remainder of our commitment is due December 31. To this end, we are receiving a Thanksgiving Offering on November 18, designated for World Service. There will be special Thanksgiving Offering envelopes in the pews and the Bulletin on that day.
