A word from Pastor Darryl

This past Sunday we began our Annual Stewardship Campaign for 2016 with a sermon series entitled: "Celebrating Our Connectional Ministries." The sub-topic on Sunday was "Deal or No Deal." This is a play-off of the television game show where contestants selected a briefcase with an amount of money that could be anywhere from one penny to \$1 million. Then they opened the other briefcases on stage to determine the amounts that were not in their case and to narrow down the possible amounts that could be in their case. Every so often, the "banker" made a money offer to the contestant. (Pause) Sometimes those offers even came with only one case left on stage besides the contestant's case. What made the show interesting, of course, was that no one knew what would happen if the contestant kept playing. That's where the drama and ratings came in. In last Sunday's Scripture reading (Jeremiah 31;31-34), Jeremiah talks about two possible "deals" or arrangements between God and God's Old Testament people living in ancient Judah. The word that is used to describe these two possible deals is "covenant." But unlike the game show, Deal or No Deal, we can see in advance which of the two covenants is the better deal. In fact, God explicitly states that God's New Covenant is the best deal. "The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a New Covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah...I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people.For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more." Sins forgiven and forgotten; iniquity against God pardoned for the sake of God's Son; our shortcomings separated as far as the East is from the West and thrown into the sea of forgetfulness. No strings attached; no fine print on the bottom of the page. A one-sided deal...a unilateral covenant signed, sealed, and secured in the holy, precious saving grace of Jesus Christ! Jesus leaves nothing, absolutely nothing for us to do — not even one-tenth of one percent. Now that's quite a deal isn't it? The gratitude and generosity for what God continues to be to us and do for us is why we share in this stewardship campaign year after year. Not because of

what I do for you or what the church gives to you, or even what we do for each other, but rather what God continues to do for us and be to us that we offer our stewardship of giving to this church. That's the deal! As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship!

Child Care during worship... Located in Room 9 on the lower level

Parents PLEASE NOTE ...

- 1. An adult needs to accompany children and sign them in to the child care room. Unaccompanied children will not be admitted without being properly sign in.
- 2. Children will only be released from child care to the parent who has signed them in or someone they have designated.
- 3. The number of children cannot exceed a 1:7 ratio by law.

The child care providers will care for older children ONLY if the number of children is lower than the number allowed by law (1:7 ratio) If infants and toddlers are present older children will not be cared for in the child care room.

The **Sky Box** is available for families with children who would like to see and hear the worship service, but need a quiet space for their children. Materials are also available on the back shelf of the worship space for older children.

The care and safety of your children is important to us. Thank you for following these procedures.
