It's going to be a long road of recovery and rebuilding following Hurricane Michael, the most powerful hurricane in nearly 50 years to hit the continental U.S. The Florida Panhandle was hit hardest. The flooding caused by heavy rain, the storm surge, and the fierce wind ripped some homes, churches, and businesses off their foundations, left many without a home, and in some cases, resulted in death. Thousands are still without power and it will remain like that for some time. Meanwhile, many are still recovering in North Carolina and Texas from other recent hurricanes and storms.

Mike Block, Director of Missional Engagement for the Upper New York Conference, has given a few **ways we can help make a difference** in the lives of those who have been impacted.

 All are invited to participate by giving financially. Donations can be made out to Christ Church with "Disaster/Hurricane Relief" written on the memo line. Monetary donations can be used to purchase supplies in bulk used to assemble United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) kits.

- 2. UMCOR Cleaning Kits (Flood Buckets) can be assembled either as a congregation or we can partner with neighboring churches (such as Harris Hill UMC, see note below) to assemble kits together. <u>Click here for assembly instructions</u>. It costs about \$75 to assemble one cleaning bucket if items are bought at cost at your local grocery or convenience store. If you or your group is interested in saving money and producing two kits for the price of one, send your donation to UNY Mission Central HUB and Mike Block will order the supplies for you at a bulk rate and have it shipped directly to Christ Church. All items will meet UMCOR requirements.


conversation during the three-week period.
