Parting Thoughts:

There is an old hymn that I learned from one of the original Christian "rock and rollers" (Larry Norman). It began: when you know a wonderful story you don't let it go unsaid. You tell it to your children as you tuck them into bed. And when you know a wonderful secret you tell it to your friends. You tell them a life time filled with happiness is like a street that never ends. Sing that sweet sweet song of salvation . . . There is a lot of anxiousness about evangelism in main line churches. The word evangelism raises specters of white shoed TV preachers; people on street corners with megaphones; people knocking on my door like door to door salesmen of years ago. Fortunately those specters are NOT what evangelism is or is about. Christian evangelism is rooted in our own experience. This is critical when we are reading the Gospels. The followers of Jesus never told people to believe in something. The followers of Jesus told people "something happened!" They had experienced, first hand, the powerful resurrection of Jesus and this experience gave them new life, hope and direction. The point of my being a follower of Jesus Christ is not that I have come to "believe" something about him. The point is I have experienced Jesus Christ in my life and that experience has made me a new person and is making me into the man I am today. That is the sweet song of salvation. It is where the story of what happened with Jesus connects with my story and a whole new story ensues. There is a near infinite variety of experiences of Jesus – in some ways they are all different – there is, however, a universal element to every one of these stories: they are encounters with Jesus who is alive and present with us. If we would get off trying to force others to 'believe' something and simply tell our

story, I believe more and more of our friends, family, neighbors and coworkers would come to know Jesus in a transforming way.

That's my story . . . what's yours?
