A word from Pastor Darryl

Thanks to our worship leaders, Beth Reilly and the Altar Guild team, and you as worshippers for making Sunday's World Communion Service an enriching and meaningful experience for all. For your week's reflection, I will like to offer you these thoughts:

There are some Biblical and Theological Foundations that accompany the encounter of Jesus and the Samaritan Woman for whom I have given this nameless, faceless woman a name, Sammy – a gutsy name for a gutsy woman!

God is Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer of all creation. All people are a loving expression of God's creative work. "Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and God's love is perfected in us." (1 John 4:11-12)

God's saving grace is inclusive for all. "For God so loved the world that God gave God's only Son so that everyone who believes [in Him] may not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16) "There is no longer Jew nor Greek, there is no longer slave nor free, there is no longer male nor female; for all are one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians3:28) From this company of believing people, God calls individuals into the representative ministry of the church.

And last but by no way least, the Christian church was given birth at Pentecost when God's Holy Spirit came to empower it for witness and mission. "People from every part of the world were present in Jerusalem on that day, and did receive the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:5-11). God gives the Spirit for ministry to all God's diverse people.

At the heart of the encounter of Jesus and Sammy is the need to foster mutual relationships with people, especially with people who are different from us. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, and it continues to be true: "We are all caught in the inescapable network of mutuality, tied into a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly." Our relationship to offer Christ to others and reconciliation efforts must affirm and demonstrate the truth that every person, every culture and every nation has something valuable to offer and contribute to the world. It is in the splendor and beauty of our own cultures and nationalities that we embrace a new paradigm of sharing the good news that brings all the pieces of the puzzle together – and we understand that to do anything less, just doesn't make sense. So we commit ourselves to the Beloved Community by building right relationships with all people and to be the people of reconciliation in every way that's possible. As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship!

Child Care during worship... Located in Room 9 on the lower level

Parents PLEASE NOTE ...

- 1. An adult needs to accompany children and sign them in to the child care room. Unaccompanied children will not be admitted without being properly sign in.
- 2. Children will only be released from child care to the parent who has signed them in or someone they have designated.
- 3. The number of children cannot exceed a 1:7 ratio by law.

The child care providers will care for older children ONLY if the number of children is lower than the number allowed by law (1:7 ratio) If infants and toddlers are present older children will not be cared for in the child care room.

The **Sky Box** is available for families with children who would like to see and hear the worship service, but need a quiet space for their children. Materials are also available on the back shelf of the worship space for older children.
