A word from Pastor Darryl

This past Sunday we began a 3-week sermon series on "Leadership." The sub-topic that we focused on was "Creative Leadership - Discovering Pathways to Imagination, Creativity & Passion." I shared with us our need to consider the important principles of God's gift of creativity. So often in my ministry as a pastor, I discover that the artistic creative domain of our members' lives has been covered or layered over; that for some reason this potential is blocked. Many leaders and members mouth the right words, but there is no heartbeat, no soul, no passion to what we truly want to offer through our gifts and abilities in the church. I told the story of a group of leaders made up of pastors and lay people in one of our large UM churches in Indiana that took a trip to Disneyland. Some found it quite strange, even weird, that they would take this trip to explore the creativity and imagination of Disney. In fact, they had access to Disney's executives and producers to discover their pathways to imagination, creativity and passion! This Disney trip was no ordinary trip - rather it was a trip of deep reflection - attempting to arrive at a Spirituality of Creativity, seeking to find answers to one of the questions Herb Miller poses in his book, Leadership is Key; what is the shape of your creativity? And so my questions for us at Christ Church are: what is the shape of our creativity in light of the gospel and the culture around us? How are we making our various ministries at Christ Church relevant, innovative, creative and connected to our culture and unlocking our ministry effectiveness? I truly believe that every person at Christ Church is a creative person, with creative gifts such as - painting, writing, music, dance, design, photography, and so on, all within the life of our church. We at Christ Church have the potential to keep moving forward, opening new doors, and doing new things, because our imagination will lead us

down new paths. Remember - all human endeavors involve creative gifts and abilities, from a simple setting of the table for dinner to the building of a vast cathedral. Anytime we place ourselves into a task or project we are being creative. Anytime we inject humor into a situation we are being creative. Anytime we apply the knowledge, ability and skill that God has given us to a task at hand, we are being creative. If we can imagine it, dream it, we can do it! What a blessing, what a delight!

Let's continue to hold in our prayers the people of the beautiful peaceful island of Dominica. These last few days have been very difficult and traumatic for the people there. As I shared with you my younger son, Duane lives there with his mother. They are safe but remain in shock over the devastation. The reports out of Dominica is that beyond the 20 people confirmed dead, there are over 50 people still missing and perhaps even more.

I was pleased to receive a phone call on Monday from Jack Anick, the UMCOR Director of Disaster Relief for the Caribbean region. They are doing a lot of preparation work in anticipation of the airport being open this week for flights. We here at Christ church can make contributions to this disaster relief effort by writing a check/money order to Christ UMC (in the Memo – Dominica Hurricane Erika). We will then send on your behalf our contributions to UMCOR International Disaster Response (IDR) Advance to help the people of Dominica.

As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. See you in church and always invite someone to join us for worship!
