A word from Pastor Darryl

This past Sunday we concluded our 3-week sermon series on "Leadership." The sub-topic that we focused on was "Contradicting the Rules of Leadership: When Leadership and Discipleship Collide." I would like to recommend this book to you, "Leading from Within: Poetry That Sustains the Courage to Lead" by Sam Intrator and Megan Scribner. One of the moving stories to come out of September 11, 2001 involved passenger Tom Burnett on United Flight 93, which went down in Pennsylvania. He called his wife from the hijacked plane, realizing by then that two other planes had crashed into the World Trade Center. "I know we're going to die," he said. "But some of us are going to do something about it." And because they did (they led), many other lives were saved. Since that awful morning, the memory of their heroism has inspired us, but it should also instruct us (shared by former Secretary of State, Madeleine Albright). As a church we know that it is Leadership – adaptive, creative, courageous and even audacious leadership that would allow us to respond from the nudging of an inner voice, that is, from our own realization that we need to meet at the intersections of dreaming and doing. That the choices we make as leaders and members of Christ Church will influence the expression of the

church for generations to come. Jesus himself had some choices to make when you take a closer look at his leadership peculiarities and the many times Jesus violated specific, clear, and time-tested rules of leadership, slowing the momentum of his own ministry, starting controversies where he didn't need to and such. So when God's Spirit tells us to contradict rules of leadership, we should do it. What do we do when we are confronted with breaking the rules of leadership for the sake of the kingdom? I want to encourage us to choose Jesus' ways of leading every time! I believe we have this moment at Christ Church, to show that our spiritual life, our theology, and the laws of leadership can synergize beautifully in our church, in our ministries, and in our neighborhoods, to get near Jesus' bold, courageous, audacious, and counter-cultural leadership practices that would allow us to keep growing! Keep challenging ourselves! Keep getting better!

I share with you here the responses of 14-18 year olds at a leadership camp held at one of our conference camp sites: in a very open and spontaneous conversation we asked them this question: how do you view the church? We want a church that has the courage to lead; we want a church that includes all races, all ages and all lifestyles; we want a mission-minded church that reaches out to its local community as a bold Jesus-loving inclusive faith community; a church where the youth of the church have a real 'say' in the church; a church that makes room for new and different thinking leadership; the church needs to know we have friends who love Jesus but hate what we've done with him; that we have friends who are considered misfits; a church that sees church beyond Sunday mornings. This should inspire us but it should also instruct us as Jesus' leadership practices are meant to do. My dear friends, I support leadership that makes disciples engaged, inspired, informed and invested! As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship!
