Hi Everyone:

Another day, another seemingly senseless act of violence. 12 innocents dead (plus the gunman) in shooting spree in the US Navy Yard (of all places). We watch our TVs and we bemoan another senseless shedding of human blood. We wring our hands and we wonder what went wrong this time and when will it stop. As Christ followers we should know better. The human being is flawed and broken. The central evidence of this flaw is the human propensity for violence (Genesis 6:11). John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, once said that the doctrine of original sin (the biblical teaching that we are all essentially flawed) was the only doctrine of the church that could be proven empirically. If you want to see evidence of human brokenness all you need to do is stand on a street corner and watch. Most of us do not wear our brokenness on our sleeves and most of us are pretty good at keeping our emotions and other tendencies under check but the reality and context in which we live is that the very best of us is capable of the behavior of the very worst of us. What hope is there? Our faith gives a simple (frustratingly simple) solution: humans are transformed through direct and consistent contact with God through Jesus Christ. It is not a one and done deal – our violence is like a chronic illness – it is only through repeated exposure to Christ that we are slowly (sometimes painfully slowly) transformed and as we are transformed we align ourselves with the cause of Jesus Christ to make this world a better place. Have you spent time with Jesus Christ today? Did you make time to worship today, this week?

The Northtowns satellite of the Family Justice Center is making great progress. We now have a lease for the North Forest house that will be the home of the satellite location. We also have our building permit and remodeling has begun. We are hoping for the grand opening of the center to be in early November. 19. 4040 Harlem Road property (borders the church to the North) update: **There is nothing new to report:** here is current update:

- the sale of the property will likely be in late October the executor is working with us, exclusively, on the purchase
- there will be a Church Conference in **October** (watch for announcements this will be after worship on a Sunday and there will be at least 2 weeks' notice)

Purpose of the church conference will be three things: 1) do we make the purchase? 2) if yes to 1) will we assign the Trustees as our "building team"? And 3) if yes to 1) and 2) will we approve the necessary financing to see it through. All Christ Church members will have voice and vote at this meeting.

- short term financing a member of the congregation has agreed to provide a "Bridge Loan" until a conventional mortgage can be obtained. This loan will allow us to purchase the property in the window available to us.
- The short term plan: is to rent the house until we can finish a capital campaign to pay for the installation of a new parking lot and, perhaps, reduce the mortgage
- The long term plan is to tear the buildings down and put in a new parking lot with sufficient green space.

We are waiting to be able to inspect the property – we cannot hold our church conference until we have had the facility inspected by a professional inspector and the District Committee on buildings. Our inspection will not happen until after an impending "estate sale". Watch for more details as they become available to us.

Parting Thought:

I've been reading an excellent book titled <u>Unbinding the Gospel</u>. The unvarnished focus of the book is about sharing our faith in Christ with others. The Author, a United Methodist by the name of Martha Grace Reese, makes a very simple argument in her book. She says that people always talk about what they have deep passion about. Think about it – the water cooler chats on Monday were about the Bills last second win (lots of passion there). We all have hobbies: model trains, golf, books we love, gardening, film, music of all kinds, etc. and, when given opportunity, we love to tell others about them. Martha Reese strongly suggests that "main line" churches have little to no effectiveness in evangelism for the simple reason that most main line churches are not passionate about their relationship with Jesus Christ. In Wesley's day, most Methodist preachers considered themselves "brands plucked from the burning". That is to say they had deep personal acquaintance with a wasteful and sinful life before they entered into a relationship with Jesus Christ and began a whole new journey. My story is like that. My life was (and still is) transformed through my relationship with Jesus Christ. I talk about this relationship because this relationship is the very heart of my life. Martha Reese would encourage us to discover and rediscover our passion as Christ followers by discovering or rediscovering our core relationship with Jesus. Where is your passion?
