Hi Everyone:

I am enjoying looking at Facebook posts of photographs of all the kids and parents heading back to school. I'm sure between now and the end of the week there will be dozens more. In a schooled culture, like ours, there are two times in the calendar year that encourage fresh starts and new beginnings. The first is the changing of the calendar and the New Year – most of us start the New Year with some kind of self improvement plan. The second is the week after Labor Day and all the flurry and fuss over getting "back to school." I want to go to the supply store and buy new pens and pencils and fresh paper. I want to get a new back

pack and buy some new books. I want to get a compass and a protractor (even if I've forgotten what they are for). I want to get back to learning and on with the next stage (grade) of life. Every September from just before my 5th birthday to just before my 25th, I started back to some kind of school (kindergarten, primary school, junior high school, senior high school, college, and seminary). That works out to 20 straight years and even if I haven't been back to school in September for the last 33 years (the doctoral work was not done on a semester basis) it is still hard wired into me to begin some kind of new learning after Labor Day. Rather than fight the urge I am trying out some new things. I am starting a plan to refocus my day around the monastic hours.
