Thank you to all of you who helped set up and serve and clean up (especially Joe, Scott, Tom, Arianna, Viki, Hannah, Brad, Barb and Ben). Thank you Dave Wolf, Christ Church custodian, for putting everything back where it belonged after we moved it all around!! Thank you to Peggy Bermudez and Janelle Martin for ticket printing, sales and for overseeing the assignment of auction numbers (with help from Ben and Brad). Thank you (HUGE STYLE) to Patti Bechtel and Barb Critoph (and their helpers Don and Dave) for arranging the baskets for auction (they looked spectacular). And for all of you who made baskets and/or donated items for the auction. (THANK YOU AND FORGIVE ME – for anyone I left off this thank you list!) The Dinner netted just over \$1300 (after we sold the left overs) and the Auction netted just over \$1300 as well for a total of just over \$2600 for the event! Thank you, all of you, who donated food and who came to eat and do battle over those choice baskets. The money raised has covered the balance of our on-the-ground expenses and a sizeable gift for several projects in Uganda. I also wanted to thank all of you who answered my invitation to support my friend, Rev. Davis Matovu, and his new church plant in Uganda. Those gifts crossed \$1000 early on and will greatly enhance his faith community's ability to be Christ's hands and feet in Seeta, Uganda. THANK YOU – Christ UMC for your generosity, your support and your encouragement. Please hold Joe Fort and I in your prayers for the next 3+ weeks as we follow Christ's lead to Uganda.

Here is what is happening at Church:

1. You've probably noticed (if you drive by) that there are a dozen workers wandering around our roof! The roof (from the main entrance to the parking lot) is being replaced this week. The roof over the Sanctuary will need to be replaced in the not-too-distant future (price tag \$25,000). If you would like to contribute to replacing the Sanctuary roof please see me or Tom Weaver.

2. Attendance last Sunday was in the 120's. We dedicated the new garden sculpture (with deep appreciation to Lisa Lawson and Dave Mitchell). We learned about the importance of having accountable relationships in our spiritual lives.

3. This Sunday is the last in the series on "Take Five for a New Life". Part 5 is titled "Mission and Ministry." I believe that Christianity only comes to us on its way to someone else. If we are the only one who benefited, it was not real. The focus of Jesus' ministry was to bring grace and new life and a new way of living to the entire world – NOT just for a few. The focus of Jesus ministry was not individual salvation but the ushering in of the Kingdom of God. As Christ-followers we are

called and challenged to live life as fully devoted apprentices of Jesus Christ and to be constantly looking to make the world a better place – a just place, a healing place.

This is WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY – we will be celebrating Communion together.

This is **Blessing of the Animals** Sunday – in honor of St. Francis of Assisi's birthday. All creatures, great and small, which are brought to Church (10:00 or Noon), will have a prayer of thanksgiving and blessing said over them.

We will commission (recommission?) a missionary to Uganda this Sunday.

Parting thought

As an apprentice to Jesus Christ I am striving to learn to do what he does and to become who he is – to walk in the steps of the Master. Like any apprenticeship there are times of great success and accomplishment and there are times of failure and frustration. I have come to learn on my journey with Jesus that the failures are more significant learning experiences than the successes. I have joked that I am going to write a book on how to build a congregation that will be titled <u>All the Really Great Growth Ideas that Didn't Work</u>. In my 30 plus years of ministry experience I have certainly learned more from the projects that didn't work and I have grown because of it. On the spiritual journey there is no perfect, nor will we attain perfection in this life (there may be perfect moments and perfect experiences . . . but they are fleeting). What we have on this journey are constant opportunities for growth. I have learned as a beginner in prayer and as a student

of the Bible. I have grown through experiences of worship and accountable relationships. I have been transformed every time I choose to get my hands dirty helping others and striving to make this world a better place. It is quite the ride. Mission and Ministry is the final test of growth on the journey. People often make one of two mistakes – 1) they go straight to mission and ministry without doing the apprentice work of prayer, bible study, worship and accountable relationship – this leads to doing social work (as opposed to mission) and a shallow spiritual life; or, 2) they learn to pray, read the bible, worship and work with a small group but never give anything back – this leads to a self-centered spirituality that is not Biblical Christianity. Learning to live into the entire package of following Jesus is the key. Be courageous and begin to add the pieces you need to be a more complete apprentice for Jesus!
