### A word from Pastor Darryl

I am very pleased to hear the inspiring witness and stories shared last Sunday in our worship experiences. My thanks to our United Methodist Women for providing the opportunity for our members who were on the Uganda Mission Team to share on the national Children's Sabbath theme, "How Long Must I Cry for Help? Bending the Arc toward God's Vision of Justice for Children." My thanks also to Sally and her team in collaboration with the Uganda Mission Team in hosting a "sleep over" this past weekend for our Faith Xpress kids as they had the opportunities to learn and participate in the African experience! Pope Francis has reminded the Church and the world that "children are the greatest blessing God has bestowed on us... to focus our attention on the suffering which many children are experiencing. From the first moments of their lives, some are rejected, abandoned, and robbed of their infancy and future...Every child who begs on the streets, who is denied an education or medical care, is a cry to God. Too often, these children become prey to criminals, who exploit them for commerce or violence. Even in wealthy countries, they suffer due to family crises and living conditions which are at times inhumane. In every case, their childhood is violated in body and soul. How did Jesus respond to the children and their parents who brought them to him: 'Let the children come to me... for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven' (Mt 19:14). How beautiful the trust of these parents, and the response of Jesus! And there are many extraordinary parents who daily make sacrifices for their children. The Church offers her maternal care to all children and their families, and she brings them the blessing of Jesus. May we always care for our children, not counting the cost, so that they may never believe themselves to be mistakes, but always know their infinite worth."

The sharing of stories, songs and food last Sunday for Children's Sabbath was indeed a joy-filled celebration for those of you who were able to be a part of it. We will have the opportunity this coming Sunday to continue this celebration as we get a "Taste of Cultures" from within our congregation and from friends who will join us for worship and an "International Community Meal" for **World Communion Sunday**. Remember to **bring a dish to share** that represents your family's cultural heritage. As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. Invite someone to join us for worship!

# New information about child care during worship...

Our Child Care room has moved to room #9 located across from the double door entrance at the bottom of the stairs off of the main entryway. (Door covered with butterflies) This room is nearer the worship space and has a lavatory attached.

#### Parents PLEASE NOTE ...

Child care is provided each Sunday morning for little ones – **infants through Pre K** as stated in our worship bulletin. Our child care providers, Julie Sciolino and Leanne Paddock, are often caring for older children as well. They want to remind parents...

- 1. An adult needs to accompany children and sign them in to the child care room.
- 2. The number of children cannot exceed a 1:7 ratio by law.

3. Children will only be released from child care to the parent who has signed them in or someone they have designated.

The child care providers will **not** allow children into the room unaccompanied by an adult and properly signed in.

The child care providers will only care for older children if the number of children is lower than the number allowed by law (1:7 ratio)

If infants and toddlers are present, older children will not be received in the child care room.

The **Sky Box** is available for families with children who would like to see and hear the worship service, but need a quiet space for their children.

The care and safety of your children is important to us. Thank you for following these procedures.
