# Windfalls

We have an apple tree in our front lawn typically productive every other year, this being a productive year. It's an early season apple which means the fruit is largely ripe and the tree has begun dispersing its fruit with every slight breeze or sideways look. Any fruit which falls from a tree in an orchard is not allowed to be sold to the public or used for other purposes. I don't run an orchard to sell to the public, so I have been collecting our windfalls sometimes three times a day and can testify, and remember an orchard owner back when I served a church in Niagara Falls claiming the same, the best fruit is often that which you can collect from the ground. It is a testament to its ripeness / readiness. So if you can catch them shortly after they have fallen, you have the absolute best.



I have thought about this a lot this year due to the number of apples falling ... and its got me thinking about who Jesus called as disciples, who he taught and healed, who he associated with, and God's grace in general. It wasn't the most perfect people still hanging in the tree, but the windfalls that laid upon the ground. They had been knocked off by the winds of social exclusion, of physical malady, of vocational isolation, and a host of other reasons. But Christ didn't see them as unvalued or unworthy. In fact, I would argue that Christ saw the best fruit lying in wait to be picked up by God's grace. Where the world sees unworthiness and mistakes, God sees only the best.

Heaven knows that I certainly feel like a windfall and not a picture of perfection. Thanks be to God that we are not passed over or passed by, but picked up by grace.

(Feel free to stop by and pickup a windfall or pick from the tree. We will be picking them all to press cider this weekend!)

# Ways to Make a Difference

#### **Food & Supplies Needed for Local Families**

In addition to the food that goes to local food pantries, Christ Church serves local families in need. The following items are needed: **cleaning supplies**, **paper towels**, **toilet paper**, **personal hygiene products**, **deodorant**, **and soap**.

The Tiger's Den is collecting condiments (ketchup, mustard, mayo, syrup), flour, sugar, oil, and salt during the summer. They also request paper bags and reusable shopping bags (*NOT plastic bags*) to pack groceries.

Collecting carts at Christ Church are marked for Tiger's Den Food Pantry and for local families.


