# A word from Pastor Darryl

This past Sunday we continued our 3-week sermon series on "Leadership." The sub-topic that we focused on was "Developing Spiritual Leaders: Leaders Take the Journey Too." We saw how James and John, sons of Zebedee, and their mother missed the mark on all the basic leadership essentials that Jesus offered to us in his ministry and the Apostle Peter proclaimed to the church in Asia Minor: "...whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant...the Human One came not to be served but to serve...whoever serves must do so with the strength that God supplies, so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ." We were all encouraged to make as part of our spiritual leadership development as followers of Christ these other important principles:

Leaders become great not because of their power, but because of their ability to empower others – John Maxwell; The X-Factor of great leadership is not

personality its humility – Jim Collins; Good leaders must first become good servants – Robert Greenleaf; Leadership is action not position – Donald McGannon; Great leaders don't set out to be a leader...they set out to make a difference; It's never about the role – always about the goal – Lisa Haisha; Be the kind of leader you will follow – Unknown. In the words of Albert Einsten, "the time has come to replace the image of success with the image of service." To serve others is a leadership essential we all have the capacity to possess as followers of Christ. It is a reversal of values, the pursuit of discipleship that Jesus considered urgent for his followers then and now. In other words, we are called and commanded to be a servant. In fact, God created us in such a way that we will not find ultimate fulfillment until we are serving others – the simple act of service as leadership, simple everyday leadership – as simple as signing up to be a host at our Connection Café on Sundays; to be an usher or greeter on Sundays; to join our Visitation Team to visit those in need of a care-giving visit; a phone call to a friend or neighbor to pray; or just giving the time of day to someone – "lollipop moments" as Drew Dudley brought that home to us in one of his TED videos – simple but meaningful acts of service. Servant leadership is not a characteristic reserved for the extraordinary - rather it is to help every one of us discover the leader within ourselves; because every single one of us has been the catalyst for a "lollipop moment." To redefine leadership if we wish to live lives that really matter by seeking to serve others in our faith journey. As always, I am praying for you and with you daily. May God's love and blessings be always with you, and my love to all of you. See you in church and always invite someone to join us for worship!
