Hi Everyone:

The signs are all around us that we are ramping down out of summer. The Erie country fair has come and gone (the State Fair starts Thursday). Back to school sales have filled the market places (along with, sigh, the Halloween candy – I mean, really? Two months early?). We even caught a nice even chill this past week to remind us that sunshine and 85 does not last forever (unless, of course, you live in equatorial Africa). The last two weeks of August (the two weeks before my birthday) is inventory time for me. I have done this inventory for the past 35 years. I make space in these weeks to assess where I am spiritually, relationally, professionally, etc. I take time to see what is working and what is not working; what needs to change and what can stand pat; what needs to be renewed and what can be allowed to lapse. I believe it is vital for personal and spiritual growth, at least once a year, to take a long, hard, honest look at my life and make the necessary adjustments. How are you doing this late August?

Here is what is going on at Church:

1. Attendance last Sunday was 97 (first time this year below 100). Between vacations, camps, back to college and all the rest a lot of us were away (you missed the best sermon that involved growing egg plant I've ever preached). Special thanks to Bill and Marge Bouza who provided special music and to Bill who led the musical side of worship for both Sunday gatherings.

- 2. This Sunday, August 26, I am preaching from Ephesians 6. Paul concludes his letter to the Ephesians by reminding them to be fully equipped for the challenges that are ahead. I once saw a sign in the Inner Hebrides that said "there is no such thing as bad weather, only inappropriate clothing". Are you dressed for spiritual success?
- 3. **HOLY LAND CLASSIC 2013** January 28, 2013 a group (we are currently 8) of us will be visiting the Holy Land. All proceeds will support our Uganda Mission Team: John Miller, Kathryn Weaver and Pastor BJ Norrix. They depart on October 1 for 17 days. Each team member has purchased their own plane ticket (\$1050) and we are raising funds to cover our on the ground expenses (so we are not a burden of any kind to our hosts) and to leave funds for the mission project.

I've been reading an excellent book by Dallas Willard titled The Divine Conspiracy. Among other things, Dr. Willard suggests that American consumerism has control of many American Christian churches. This consumerism, he suggests is revealed in how often we are controlled by our "likes and dislikes" at church rather than responding to the call to Discipleship. Becoming a disciple of Jesus is not an easy thing. Becoming a disciple requires me to begin to bend my will and desires to the ways of Christ. Becoming a disciple forces me out of the "what do I want" consumer model to the "what does Jesus intend" biblical model. It is a very different way of living our faith. I have long suspected that there is a deep part of each of us that earnestly desires more from our faith that deeply desires to grow spiritually and in our relationship with God. It is such a profoundly countercultural life style that few choose this path. My hope, as your pastor, is that more and more of us will take the deeper plunge. My prayer is that more and more of us will (as I said Sunday) will stop paddling about in the shallow end of the faith pool and sail for deep adventure: deep adventure in the life of prayer, in the life of love, in the life of mission and service, in all aspects of life.
