Friday's Spaghetti Dinner, silent auction, etc. fund raiser was such a great example of your support and encouragement. We raised \$2500+ for our mission projects in Uganda and our on the ground expenses. There are dozens of folks to thank but let me list a few who are representative of the whole. I do not, like Bill Hybels so eloquently put it, ever want to reach out a well manicured and soft and un-calloused hand and grasp the nail scarred hands of my savior. So, here's to taking care of our selves . . . but, more importantly, here's to spending our lives and using them in ways that matter and have significance and have an impact on the transformation of the world.
