We have to pack our mission supplies (medical, dress our people clothing etc.) and it cannot weigh more than 50 pounds per bag. We have money to arrange, transportation to double check and, at least in my case, sermons to prepare, bible lessons to prepare and all the rest. We do covet your prayers and ask you to keep on praying until we return (October 17). John, Kathy and I will be commissioned this Sunday as part of our morning worship – come and pray over us. Pray for our families and for the good people of Uganda with whom we go to work. Even though this is my 7th journey into Africa, I am quite excited about what God can and will do through us on the journey. Please pray for Pastor Clair Mosher and Esther Keeney as well as they make final preparations for this journey.

Parting Thoughts

As I was preparing for my first Uganda journey, about 5/6 years ago, I was whining a bit about long air plane rides and "substandard conditions." About that time I ran across an account of an English Clergyman who was traveling to the Upper Nile Region (aka Uganda) as a missionary in 1890. According to this pastor's account, in preparation for his mission he sold his house and all his possessions, he wrote out his last will and testament, and he prepared for a journey that he assumed he would never return home from. The journey from London to Lake Victoria took just over a year. The journey was to sail to Cairo and then sail up the 4000 mile long Nile river portaging around the various waterfalls and rapids. Most 19th century missionaries never returned and a significant percentage died on the journey. Kathy, John, Clair, Esther and I will be inconvenienced for about 34 hours on an airplane (round trip) and 7-8 hours in a van. We will have fairly modern conveniences and protection from difficulties. When the travel gets a bit wearisome I always think about this pastor from 120 years ago and say "suck it up Norrix, you got it easy on the travel end!"

I believe that somewhere in every Christian there beats the heart of an adventurer, an explorer and a daring believer who will follow God's call no matter how different or how odd or how "risky" it might seem when compared to the hum drum of our day to day lives. Somewhere in the heart of every Christian there beats the heart of a lion or lioness that

desires above all to live the unfettered and consequence making life. I don't claim to be all that brave and I don't claim to have anywhere near the courage that 1890 clergyman had. What I do claim is a desire to follow Jesus to not count the cost and to serve wherever, whenever and however I can. That's probably outrageously bold of me but having taken the step of faith I cannot imagine living any other way.
