

With Joy... From Sally

In 17th Century England, as the Church of England was established as the dominant church of the country, a certain stability was achieved for religious belief in general as everyone worshiped in the same way. However, it began to be noticed by Anglican

priest George Whitfield and brothers John and Charles Wesley that it also created complacency and spiritual "dryness" among believers. Religion was becoming a pastime in which people would "go through the motions" during religious services without deeply-felt conviction or engagement of the heart and soul. During this Great Awakening that began in England and moved to the American colonies both Whitfield and John Wesley preached sermons with the title, "Almost Christian," sharing their own thoughts based on King Agrippa's response to an encounter with Paul found in Acts (26:28), "Almost thou persuadest me to be a Christian." (KJV) Both men addressed the half-hearted spirituality of the people...the tendency to follow church rules without loving God and neighbor as Christ loved us. For Wesley, the difference between an "almost Christian" and an "altogether Christian" came down to love, a command written on the heart. "Almost Christian" ...thought-provoking words.

As we begin the season of Lent, we'll have many opportunities to consider our own identity in the body of Christ and our own excitement for and commitment to our faith. Faith is a matter of desire for God & a desire to share God's self-giving love with others in Jesus' name. Love gives Christianity its purpose and meaning, and, as Christ-followers, it gives meaning to our lives as well. Love is the absolute core of God's relationship with humankind shown in the life, death, and resurrection new life of Jesus Christ and the living presence of the Holy Spirit in the world today. Patterning our lives and our church on Christ's self-giving love requires grace, commitment...soul-strength...not "almost Christian", but "all-the-way Christian." In the pages of this *Caller* you'll find many opportunities for considering your own faith journey...Bible study groups, Lenten study groups, invitations to be in mission and ministry, worship celebrations, and opportunities to surround yourself with a community of love and encouragement.

Go deeper go wider . . .

The leadership team of Christ Church is in the process of setting goals for the future. The Goal is to have 100 in Sunday school and 500 in Worship by 2015 (1 and 5 by 15). We also are setting the goal of having 100% of

the Christ Church community involved in some level of mission and/or ministry. Those are high goals but I believe they are quite attainable. The bigger question is how? How will we reach these goals? If just filling the building on Sunday were the goal, we could put a sign on the lawn that said "free Beer Sunday at 11:00". I am pretty sure we would fill the building. But it wouldn't be a church.


A survey of history reveals that Churches have been built up by using a variety of methods. Some have been built by focusing on the negatives. These churches were built by being against (insert oppressed group here). They are against blacks, Jews, masons, gay people; or against certain behaviors: smoking, drinking, etc; or against certain theologies or philosophies; as I said fill in the blank. Others have been built around more positive causes: we are for civil rights, for women rights, for (again fill in your preferred cause.) If the goal was just to build a large organization, any and all of these approaches could be effective. However, I don't believe any of these would be the radical community Jesus intended.

The building up of the Christian Church is a building up of the body of Christ. What this means is that the church is built by moving in two directions at the same time. The church has to go spiritually deep and must be led by people who are profoundly committed to living Christ's ways. The Church also has to go radically wide, in essence exploding outward in love and service. That is the biblical journey that our founder, John Wesley, clearly and consistently articulated. Personal holiness -- going deeper in our spirituality and deeper into living Christ's ways -- is simultaneously lived out in social holiness -- exploding outward making a difference for Jesus, working against oppression and injustice in whatever forms they present themselves. This is helping to build the reign of God and will build a magnetic Christian church community.

As your pastor, I want you to know this is my goal: I want to lead us into becoming a deeper and wider church. I want us to go deep in our faith in Jesus, deep in our love for him, deep in our understanding of how he calls us to be and to do. I want to lead us into becoming a wide church that shows concern for the poor and the oppressed; locally, regionally, and around the world. Christ Church, to be a great church, will need to go deeper and wider!

ASH WEDNESDAY: FEBRUARY 22, 2012

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent, which was invented by early Christian believers as a time to prepare for the great celebration of the resurrection of Jesus

Christ on Resurrection Day (aka Easter.) Lent is a 40-day season and its historic focus has been on practicing the spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting, repentance, giving of alms, etc.

Ash Wednesday gets its name from the imposition of ashes that are offered as a sign of repentance as part of the service. These ashes are not a "Roman Catholic" thing. In Old Testament times, people put ashes on their heads to show sorrow, mourning, and repentance. It's a very old tradition.

At CUMC, as part of our Lenten Study Series (A.O.L., page 3) we'll gather at 5:30 on February 22 for a light supper and the traditional Ash Wednesday observance. During the season of Lent we will meet on Wednesdays to study Rueben P. Job's *Three Simple Questions*, with light supper from 5:30–7p.

In Kirimandagi, Uganda, many students at the Blessed Primary School are orphans, and Pastor Grace and her husband have been paying their fees out of their own funds. We can help by sponsoring an orphan.
