Jesus - The Reality Show

It seems that more and more reality shows are popping up on television. I can't stand to watch most of them and I'm not sure whose reality they express, but certainly not mine. They must strike a chord with part of

the population, however, because new reality shows keep appearing. We seem to be mesmerized by stories of people and about stuff and about people with stuff! We find out more than we should want to know about who's who, what's what, and the stories behind the story.

It struck me this year as I heard again the story of Christmas from Luke's narrative that Luke gives us, "Jesus – The Reality Show. "He doesn't just give us the unfolding story of Jesus' beginnings, he gives us the connections and the relationships behind the story. Luke connects the story to the world in which it took place...names of people, places, who's in charge...and most of it is NOT a pretty picture. Into a crazy mix of people and power comes Jesus...teaching and living a new relationship with God. Luke writes his account of Jesus' life, giving it relevance in HIS time. Our mission is to give Jesus' life relevance in OUR time and place.

My reality is that Christmas is barely past, Epiphany is at hand and Lent is knocking at the door. That's life! It certainly was Jesus' life. Thirty plus years must have seemed like a finger snap. Yet Jesus brought all to completion in that time…love, forgiveness, sacrifice, new and sustaining presence through all time. So with Mary & Joseph, the magi from the east , the twelve, and the women in the garden we catch our breath, wipe our tears, and try to communicate our experience with Jesus.

FROM BJ'S DESK...



"The church exists to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." That is the mission statement of the United Methodist Church. I like it. It has punch, it has clarity, and it is biblical. We are here to grow up disciples of Jesus Christ, and disciples of Jesus Christ work for the trans-

formation of the world.

The statement (and the Great Commission in Matthew 28 that tells us to "go into all the world and make disciples . . .") begs the question: What is a disciple of Jesus Christ? A short survey reveals that there are many definitions. Some define a disciple by what the disciple does: a disciple is someone who goes to church, reads their bible, prays, works with others, is nice, and does works of kindness and mercy. Others have defined a disciple by what they believe: a disciple is someone who believes the right things and has correct theological understandings.

I would suggest that disciples of Jesus Christ are known by who they are. The transformation of an individual is done from the inside out. As I become fully devoted to Jesus Christ, I undergo a heart, focus, and thought transformation. As I become a more fully devoted follower of Jesus Christ, this inner transformation becomes revealed in my outward activity. I like to think of it this way: I practice the spiritual disciplines – prayer, study, worship, meditation, celebration, etc. – as a way to deepen my connection and relationship with Jesus Christ. This exposure to Jesus Christ changes me and I slowly and gradually become more like Jesus.

As I am slowly and gradually made more like Jesus, my values change and as my values change, my priorities change, and that leads to behavior changes. Disciples of Jesus are fully devoted and are using their gifts, talents, resources, and selves in mission and ministry.

For six Sundays beginning February 10, I will be preaching on the hallmarks of the Disciple of Jesus Christ. We will talk about prayer and study and worship. We will also talk of giving of ourselves and serving Christ in mission and ministry. I am looking forward to taking this Lenten journey with you

Journey's End -Welcoming Refugees

Christ Church has welcomed refugee families from all over the globe through Journey's End Refugee Services since 1999. Each family brings memories and traditions from its home country, abilities, skills, and dreams for a new life in the U.S. CUMC has sponsored a construction worker and a champion swimmer from Bosnia, an entrepreneur and an advocate for women and children from Sudan, a Bantu family from Somalia, a mechanic and a seamstress from Burma, a philosophy professor from Cuba who has a special place in his heart for the teachings of "Juan Wesley", and a high school math teacher and an engineer from Irao.

Members of our congregation have guided these families and formed lasting friendships. Most of the families have stayed in the Buffalo area and are helping to rebuild our community. While many people are leaving the city, the newcomers are living and working there, fixing up homes that have fallen into disrepair, and striving to create safe neighborhoods.

We plan to sponsor a new family this spring. You can help by giving household goods and furniture, helping to set up an apartment, and offering friendship to them as they learn English, explore their new community, and strive to build a better life for their family. Answering Christ's call to welcome the stranger gives these families a future with hope, enriches all our lives, and strengthens our community so that we may all live in God's abundance.
