With Joy... From Sally

What matters most? Jesus was asked that question. His response..."'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love

your neighbor as yourself." (Luke 10:27)

Love your neighbor as yourself. Could it be that simple? The Hebrew word for love, *ahavah*, means "to act lovingly toward" or "to be loyal to." It's an action rather than a feeling. Perhaps when we *act* lovingly toward our neighbor, loving *feelings* follow. But before loving our neighbor comes loving God with our lives—body, soul, strength, and mind. We should love God with everything we've got. We love our neighbors because God's love matters most. Dave Runyon in his book, The Art of Neighboring, writes, "Jesus is a genius! He is asked to pick one commandment that is more important than all the others. And he shares something that would change the world, if only every person who believes in Jesus would actually do it."

Like most churches we put a lot of time and effort into our gathering experiences, like worship, teaching/learning experiences, men's and women's gatherings, youth gatherings, etc. Gathering is meant to energize and deepen our love for God and to fuel our love for our neighbor after we leave the gathering. What if we put as much time, effort, and resources into our going out as our coming in? Getting involved with and getting to know the people around us, their stories, their hurts and hopes, and their dreams?

"My beloved friends, let us continue to love each other since love comes from God. Everyone who loves is born of God and experiences a relationship with God. The person who refuses to love doesn't know the first thing about God, because God *is* love—so you can't know God if you don't love." (1 John 4:7-8 The Message)

Loving our neighbor is difficult. But it just might make the world a better place and keep us from being self-absorbed jerks!;)




PASTOR APPRECIATION LUNCHEON SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 6TH
