Every year encourages us to awaken to the dawn of new possibilities in our lives and with our lives. Let us join together to prepare for and ultimately to welcome this reality in our lives this vear.

Though we enjoy creating a fun Christmas pageant, dressing up and all the rest, it's retelling the story that matters. It's a way we connect with God and offer the opportunity for all to hear that it's God's desire and pleasure to connect with them too. This is a story that brings us together.

We retell all kinds of stories. It happens at family gatherings, class • reunions, and memorial occasions. When we retell those stories we don't remove the unfortunate events, or the ugly parts when we weren't at our best. We include them. Sometimes we even embellish those parts! In retelling, we see them in a new way. They take on new meaning and perspective. We were with longtime friends recently recalling a camping trip when a skunk got into our tent! We retold the story with smiles and laughter, even though it wasn't so funny all those years ago! In the retelling, things are transformed. Sometimes the worst parts become the best parts.

The world seems scattered and broken for all kinds of reasons. It brings God pleasure to gather up and bring all things together nothing left out. Listen for the message of Christmas... retelling... reconciling... renewing... putting things back together.

Service Hub - Strategic Team is still at work to determine what is needed to connect people in the church and the outside community with service opportunities. (contingent on tech upgrades)

**Worship** – Strategic Team formed following Pastor Daven's settling in. The new worship schedule was determined –one worship service at 10am on Sundays. Music & Meditation and other special worship opportunities will be offered at other times.

There you have it! All of this is a direct result of the consultation process continuing to unfold in the days, months, and years to come. This is the work of the people called Christ Church—willing to do whatever it takes!



CAFÉ and HALLWAY PROJECT: Trustees are pleased to report great progress in completing the rehab and painting of the office entrance hallway and Café. Thanks to the many volunteers who have kept things moving along – paint prep crews; clean up crews; kitchen crew! Special thanks to Dave Mitchell for the beautiful new Corian countertops and kitchen serving

doors; Scott Smith electrical work, and Dick Radel's stairway handrail refinishing. The project includes funding from Bob Snyder's Memorial Funds and Trustees Capital Improvement Fund. Work has involved complete patching and priming of all painted surfaces, with two coats of new paint on the walls and trim. The hallway has all new energy efficient LED light fixtures along with new closet rods. The Café, in addition to the new serving countertop and doors, received a new drop ceiling, new LED light fixtures, and new window treatments. The Hospitality Team is working with professionals from UB School of Architecture on new interior signage to be added to the fresh paint! The next step includes new floors from the back entrance, thru the office hallway, in to the Café and continuing in to Crafts Hall – budget \$18,000, and refurbishing of Crafts Hall including new paint – budget \$10,000. However, to proceed additional funding will be needed ... maybe you can help?

Perhaps you've thought to yourself, "Whatever happened with that consultation process we began in 2016 with Pastor Jim Pollard and consultant, John Wimberley?"

Keep reading and find out!

After the initial phase with Rev. Wimberley in which the entire church community was invited to conference together, a purpose statement was created for Christ Church which says, "Making connections and offering opportunities for faith, love and service." These are the foundational words for everything that follows. Again, everyone was invited to weigh in how we would live out this purpose in our life together as the church. This was distilled into strategic areas thought to be most important.

- \*Technology \* Spiritual Formation \* Child/Family Spaces \*
- \* Connecting with our Neighbors ,\* \* Hub of Service \* and \*Worship\* (delayed until the arrival of the new pastor) \*

Strategic Teams were assigned to each area for the purpose of determining what was needed in order to "make connections and offer opportunities for faith, love, and service." *Keep reading...* 

By the time Pastor Daven Oskvig was appointed to Christ Church these teams were well under way and bringing recommendations back to the Church Council, whose role it is to keep us moving forward.

Here's what's unfolding as we partner in God's purpose of loving the world  $^{\sim}$ 

**Tech Team** – Wi-Fi in entire building, Upgrade computer and screens for worship- (*This was to be accomplished by November, but materials for screens was found to be unavailable.*) New information monitors, Upgrade website and social media

**Spiritual Formation** – Ongoing Spiritual Formation Team formed to plan and offer opportunities for study and growth for adults on Sundays, mid -week, and online opportunities (*contingent on tech upgrades*)

**Child/ Family Spaces** – The Christian Education Team created a Family Worship Space, Sky Box, and lower level upgrades. Youth room and multi-purpose rooms redecorated. Still pending is changing stations in restrooms which is a task for the trustees.

**Hospitality** – Ongoing Team formed –working on Café & building upgrades, external/internal directional signs, Sunday morning Café scheduling
