For several years I would help my uncle on his farm to bring in the harvest and prepare things for the winter. This reflective time would often prepare me for the work of ministry in Advent, Christmas, Epiphany and through Lent. Images and ideas flowed during the many hours spent alone in a tractor and combine, or

beside a grain bin and corn dryer. While I have not been able to make this trek for several years, as the weather changes and the status of the harvest spill in, my ears perk up and my imagination flows.

This year I heard a report on some preliminary findings from farmers who piloted the use of drought resistant corn. While yield levels were not the same as in the past couple of years, there was more yield per acre than the non-drought resistant varieties of seed provided. As we have been putting together our ministry plan for 2021, we are working under the constraints of this unique time, trying to figure out how we maintain and grow ministry on the yield we expect. To a degree, we are working on the drought resistance in our ministry. This is not a genetic modification to spirituality, as it is to the seed corn, but asking of ourselves and the church how resistant to drought (challenging times) it is? When things get tough (financially, physically, spiritually) are our faith and church strong and vibrant enough to withstand the challenge? When the need is greatest, are we still able to adequately connect? Are we as individuals and a community able to rise to meet the challenge so that the yield of grace and love is unaffected and unencumbered even in, especially in, times of hardship?

I pray that as we celebrate God's bounty this year, we think and plan for the future. May we seek to have not just a drought resistant faith, but a drought *proof* faith. That when friend and family, when community and region, when nation and world are desperate for the water of God's grace to drench the furrows of parched souls where hope has evaporated, we may "Make Connections and Offer Opportunities for Faith, Love and Service" providing relief and restoring hope.
