Over the past few years, I have visited at least one Major League Baseball park each year and attend many of our local Bisons games. I enjoy the unique culture of each park, watching the teams and fans. This is the time of year when I truly awaken as a fan

watching teams become contenders which not long ago were among the worst or the unexpected surges in the second half of the season as a team begins to connect.

I always look for the formula as to why this happens. There are those easy answers, like years of rebuilding, the right" management, the right players, and the team playing like ... well, a team. Certainly, that's all part of what's happened, but so also is the major change that has swept over baseball as highlighted in the book 'Moneyball' by Michael Lewis. This change focuses on the use of statistics and corresponding formulas and not necessarily on huge budgets to secure players to win games. Certainly, I am not suggesting that such an approach is good or even healthy for the church of Jesus " Christ, though heaven knows how the denomination loves its statistics! What I am suggesting is that we can't simply do church as it has been in the past and expect the same results. And just as deeply as it disrupted the culture of baseball when this path was charted, it will disrupt the way we think church should be done or think that church should be. This will be uncomfortable because it will mean change (the dirtiest word in the church lexicon).

God is calling us in fresh and new ways. What are those ways?

What will the church of God look like in the coming years? Together we can be part of that next chapter which can one day be looked back upon, seeing that God was present through our efforts to make connections and offer opportunities for faith, love, and service. Let's write that chapter together.



The summer months offered many opportunities for fun, sun, gathering with friends, meeting new people and growing together in many ways. In our worship life we had opportunities to hear God's word

as it came to a Counselor, a Deacon, and a Lawyer! Each one opened new insights for me and, I hope, for you as well.

One image from Deacon Jessica Glaser's message that has continued to play in my thoughts is the kingdom of God as a flash mob. Although my only experience of a flash mob has been seeing them unfold on social media, I know that a flash mob is a large group of people who assemble suddenly in a public place, perform an unusual action for a brief time, and then quickly disperse. I've seen people appear from random places with instruments to form a street orchestra, and a person in the middle of a shopping mall begin to sing and then be joined by others. These simple actions create moments that provide some sort of alternative reality. Everyone stops what ' they're doing for a brief time to find out "what's happening?" They're taken out of their everyday mundane existence — just for a moment." As I've been pondering Jessica's suggestion of God's kingdom community as a flash mob, I've become more aware of "kingdom moments" taking place around me. This week someone in need came to the church for help. They ended up helping me clear the clutter out of a room so painting and repurposing could take place. Or a conversation I had with a woman in the grocery store after I picked up an onion that had escaped her grip. Help offered and help received, the feeling of being needed and useful- the kingdom initiated in small, unanticipated ways.

Perhaps the rule of God's ways, or what we refer to as God's kingdom, can only happen in moments and episodes-- never fully realized. If they remained for too long they might become conventional, uninspired, and become something less. But for a few brief moments we live an alternative, we live the Kingdom, where kindness and goodness pop up in a flash and touch our lives. In this way we challenge the structures of society —we live an alternative. Perhaps others will be swept up in its flow.


