Returning to Worship at Christ Church

As we enter the "new normal" in the time of COVID-19, new rules will be in place to ensure the safety of all during worship. Please be advised of the following:

- At the time of press, churches will only be allowed to operate at 25% capacity. Please review the weekly email updates for further guidance as to how many attendees will be allowed in the church each week, and how this will be coordinated.
- All who attend will be required to wear a face mask that covers both mouth and nose.
- Only a single entrance will be used.
- All attendees must keep six feet apart while in the building.
- Every other pew will be open.
- Only two or three persons will be allowed to sit in each pew; depending on the section. Families who reside in the same household will be allowed to sit together. Please follow all directions of the ushers relative to seating.
- The ushers will dismiss all attendees at the end of worship to avoid crowding.
- No bulletins will we used.
- No congregational singing will be allowed.
- The Café will be closed before and after worship.

These guidelines will change as we move through NYS's phases of reopening. We ask for your patience and understanding as we expect the situation to be fluid over the coming weeks and months.

Members of the Outreach Team will be happy to take your items from your car and transfer them to another vehicle which will then deliver them to Tigers Den.


Funds for Seneca Street

Finance Update

The Finance Team would like to thank everyone for their strong support during these difficult times. Through May, we are ahead of budget for pledged income received!

The following steps have been taken, with Council approval, to ensure financial stability and continue paying our dedicated staff in full:

- -Applied for and received \$23,400 in Payroll Protection Program funding;
- -Took our annual \$25,000 Endowment Fund distribution in April rather than the normal 4th quarter distribution;
- -Reduced operating expenses wherever possible, including a 50% reduction in shared ministry payments.

Our cash position remains strong and sufficient to continue operations for many months to come. We are blessed by your generosity and look forward to the day we can worship together again.
