

According to old Jewish regulation, a synagogue should have twelve windows in it, each window corresponding to the 12 tribes of Israel. Artist Marc Chagall's work, the 12 Jerusalem Windows, are based on this regulation. Each tribe of Israel had its own window to heaven. Each tribe had its own ways and its own accent. Only when

all the accents were present could the divine language be spoken and understood. (You can see Chagall's windows online.)

These windows remind me of the churches of which I've been a part and others I've visited, both in the US and in other countries. No matter what size, style, or denomination, they all have their own beauty, their own experience, and their own message to convey. There's one God, one faith, one baptism, but there are many accents to those who worship the one God, one faith, one baptism. Peter, a Jew and one of Jesus' followers, affirmed that God actually chooses everyone, every nation, without any favoritism. (Acts 10:34) Although God created the world, God stands apart, in a unique position, not participating in any preference or partiality as we humans tend to do.

Christ Church is made up of its own unique blend of women, men, children, and youth who come with a variety of life styles, experiences, outlooks, opinions, expectations, commitments, convictions, and intentions. The blend changes as people come and go, pastors guide and inspire our faith, leaders give shape and order to how we live together in community, times and cultures change. We learn and live with new accents.

### **Current Community Outreach Opportunities**

NEXUS SEMINARY, UGANDA: The mission of Nexus Seminary, Uganda, is to provide quality theological training to rural Ugandan and East African Pastors and Church leaders. Nexus was started by Rev. Davis Matovu of Uganda and Rev. Alan Howe of Rome, NY, in 2006. They developed a 20-course certificate-level training

program with the goal of graduating 2000 pastors in 20 years. This fall's graduation in Kikyusa will put us almost to the 200 pastor level. Training is provided free of charge (we fund it through the Rome First United Methodist Church) and each graduate receives an NIV Study Bible and a Bible dictionary OR a Bible in Lugandan. We have seen amazing things done by our graduates including the formation of new schools, pre-schools, and other community building, life-changing ministries. If you'd like to help provide this training, see Dr. BJ for more information. He and four others from Central New York travel to Uganda October 9 - 26 to participate in this ministry and attend the fall graduations. If you would like to support Dr. BJ on this journey with prayers and/or monetary support, see him for details.

### DR. NORRIX TRAVELS TO UGANDA IN OCTOBER

Dr. B.J. Norrix, along with 4 other United Methodists (two pastors and two educators), will be traveling to Uganda October 10 through the 27. The team will be working with the Nexus Seminary, Uganda. Nexus was developed in 2006 to bring ministerial training to pastors in rural Ugandan districts, who generally do not have access to education or theological education. Nexus provides certificate-level training for these pastors at no charge.

Nexus offers a series of 20 courses in English and Lugandan, the native language of most of our students. Each graduate receives a NIV Study Bible and Bible dictionary or, if English language skills are minimal, a Bible in the Lugandan language.

Funding for the Nexus Seminary, Uganda, is handled by Rev. Alan G. Howe of the Rome First United Methodist Church. Those who wish to support this work, or sponsor a teacher, a student, or a Bible or some other aspect of the program should see Pastor B.J. Norrix, who has brochures with essential information.

The goal of Nexus Seminary, Uganda, is to train 2000 pastors in 20 years. With October's graduations we will be at 10% of our goal and rising.

Rev. Davis Matovu, President of Nexus Seminary, Uganda, was a guest in worship at Christ Church on Sunday, August 7, 2011. He spoke about the work and had many conversations with members of the congregation in the café afterwards.

If you would like to support Dr. B.J.'s journey to Uganda or wish to directly support the mission of Nexus Seminary project please speak with Dr. BJ. The journey costs \$2500+ per person (half of this is the plane ticket). Any and all support is appreciated. He will be returning in 2012 . . . perhaps God is calling you to join him?
