The un-insulated wires connecting our transformer to the power-source on the pole outside had just become twisted and arced out, cooking the transformer and leaving us and several neighbors without power. I am sure I must have looked a little shaken coming into the meeting after the drive south on Campbell Rd. to Pastor Jackie's Church, Asbury UMC, with the winds coming right out of the west, making it hard to stay on the road.

Given that scary ride, I thanked God for getting us all there safely and thanked him for the fact that these winds were the biggest of my problems. Throughout the last days in February and the first days of March, we became aware that many of our brothers and sisters throughout Indiana Illinois and Alabama were experiencing devastating tornadoes which took away homes, lives and livelihoods...

Signs help detect Elder neglect and abuse

It is estimated that 2.6 billion dollars is stolen from older Americans every year and that only 1 in 14 cases are reported.

Elder abuse is doing something or failing to do something that results in harm to an elderly person or puts a helpless older person at risk of harm.

Abuse of elders takes many different forms; these are the most common abuses, physical emotional abuse, abuse, financial abuse and neglect of the elderly. Seniors abuse has increased in the United States by people who are directly responsible for their care. Many forms of elder abuse are recognized as types of domestic or family violence. Elder abuse takes place where the senior lives, most often in the home where abusers are adult children or spouses. Institutional settings especially long term care facilities can also be a source of elder abuse.

Elder neglect is failure to fulfill a care taking obligation constitutes for more than half of all reported cases of elderabuse. The abuse can be intentional or unintentional, based on factors such as ignorance or denial that an elder person needs as much care as they do. Other family members may not recognize or take seriously the signs of elder abuse. They may appear to be symptoms of dementia or signs of the elderly person's frailty. Many signs do overlap with symptoms of mental deterioration, but that doesn't mean we should dismiss them on the caregivers say so.

The following are warning signs of some kind of elder abuse;

1. Frequent arguments or tension between the care giver and the elderly person.

2. Changes in personality or behavior in the elder person.

If you suspect elderly abuse, but are not sure look for changes in physical appearance or behavioral signs of the elderly person. The responsibilities and demand of elder caregiving escalates as the elder's condition deteriorates can be extremely stressful. The stress can lead to mental and physical health problems that make caregivers burned out, impatient, and unable to keep from lashing out against elders in their care.

Elder abuse should always be reported to National Center on Elder Abuse or through local area agencies on aging. Don't always assume that the elderly person will take care of their situation; they may not be capable of reporting the abuse.
