In my house there is no absence of holiday music as soon as is reasonable (which is a highly debated topic!) I've come to begrudgingly accept this premature Yuletide assault to the point that I now fully indulge in the habit. The issue remains, however, how this all evaporates and disappears

almost directly following December 25.

Clergy are encouraged to hold communities in Advent by focusing on those hymns and themes of the promised coming. In other words, in the focus of worship, we are to avoid the pressure of leaning ahead toward those hymns and themes that proclaim birth and arrival (Christmas Carols) until on and after December 25th. We like to move quickly into the next thing, so recognizing Christmas as a season of only 12 days and remaining in this short time festivity following the25th with all its specific music runs counter to our human condition. Moreover, the popular presence of these songs played around the clock since the beginning of November creates a scenario where to hear them and sing them for even a single day following December 25th feels like one too many.

Perhaps as we approach this year having not been able to meet in-person last year, we can actually and may want to carry these through the full season. Even more, if we can't tolerate the sound of them any longer following the 25th, perhaps we can at least focus on the message embedded in their poetry. Then Christmas might be more than a day and even a season ... for we will be a Christmas people!

Joy to the world, the Lord is come!

Let earth receive her king; let every heart prepare him room and heaven and nature sing.





Music and Meditation

Christ Church has offered a time during the season of Advent to guietly reflect and prepare. This is a short, 30minute candlelight service on Friday evenings beginning at 5:30 pm on 11/26, 12/4, 12/10, and 12/17 following

the style of Taizé (pronounced teh-zay'.) A Taizé service is a service of song and silence, prayer, and scripture that hopes to lead participants to contemplate and celebrate their relationship with God and with one another. Music repeats many times. It begins with a simple melody that is sung together and can remain that way, build as it progresses, and/or employs the addition of instruments or a soloist. All fits together, even simply experiencing the music as an observer. Texts are short and reflective. Taizé invites one to feel and interact with the readings and songs. Prayers are invitational and conversational to promote an experience of dialogue with the living present Christ.
