

# JUNE JULY AUGUST 2022

Let us use this summer as a time to feed our hunger for education, spiritual development, culture, and entertainment. Let us not lay aside our need to grow during these months, but seize the opportunity in this time to discuss, read, and participate in ways we are simply unable to during the rest of the year. It is summer and so it is time to Chautauqua!



### **Major Repair Work Update:**



You may have noticed mounds of dirt along the Saratoga side of Crafts Hall and the sanctuary and the Harlem side of the sanctuary. Due to collapse and debris in the underground pipes that carry rain water from the Crafts Hall, Narthex, and Sanctuary roofs, rain water was leaking into the building and pooling on the floor in Youth Hall. During the week between Christmas and New Years 2021 a plumbing contractor dug trenches along

the buildings and laid new drainage pipes. The dirt mounds will be left to settle until next Spring when the areas will be scraped of rocks, leveled, and seeded. Overgrown shrubbery and pine trees will be removed and replaced by new plantings. This summer, landscaping mulch will not be spread in the areas where the new drainage was laid.
