A Report from the Upper New York 2023 Conference June 1-3, 2023 in Syracuse, New York

Peggy Bermudez, Pastor Daven, and I attended the 2023 Annual Conference of the Upper New York Annual Conference, now known as *United Methodists of Upper New York*. This was the first annual conference led by our new Bishop, Héctor A. Burgos Núñez. This was my first

experience with Annual Conference, and I want to share some reflections with the membership of Christ Church.

One of the most powerful experiences was the worship and ordination ceremony; it was wonderful to see newly ordained clergy, and the joy on their faces as they received their stoles from the bishop, surrounded by friends and family.

As you can imagine, there is much business to be taken care of at Annual Conference. We voted on disaffiliation for many churches, who are seeking to leave the United Methodist Church. All the disaffiliation votes passed. The process is not yet complete, and these congregations still have many hoops to jump through, including forming new 501(c)(3)s and/or affiliating with a new denomination, possibly the Global Methodist Church. While the theme of 2023 Annual Conference was "Together!" it was clear to me that we are at a turning point in the history of the United Methodist Church.

There will be much more to come as we prepare for the United Methodist Church General Conference, taking place from April 23 - May 3, 2024, in Charlotte, North Carolina.
