

Journey's End Refugee Services







For 25 years, Christ Church has partnered with Journey's End Refugee Services to welcome new arrivals to our community. Over the years, we have welcomed families from Bosnia, Sudan, Somalia, Burma, Cuba, Iraq, and Syria.

On June 15th, we set up an apartment for a family of 5 from Iraq. The husband and father of this family is disabled, so the space needed to be accessible to accommodate his wheelchair. The Outreach Team and Church Council extend our heartfelt thanks to everyone who gave furniture and household items and those who helped with moving furniture and setting up the apartment. 25 people donated goods and 10 people helped on moving day! The Outreach Team was also able to provide one month's rent for the family thanks to YOUR support of the Cookie and Candy Sale last December and the Souper Bowl Sale in February!

Recently, we received this message from Andy Cammarata, Director of Outreach and Volunteers at JERS: "The family is doing well, they loved their home and are grateful for the additional support through the rent check. The parents are coming to JERS for English classes, the mom is also looking for a job. They seem to be stable at this time. We can't do the work without community support which we appreciate more than you will ever know!" Christ Church was recognized for our efforts with posts on the facebook pages of Journey's End Refugee Services and United Methodists of Upper New York.
