Seeking Partners in Ministry

In September, the Church Council voted to seek out partners for collaboration and ultimately consolidation in ministry. This is recognizing that we have reached a critical moment in viability and ultimately ministry vitality in this current paradigm of autonomous and siloed ministry. We seek to be proactive and not reactive looking back at not only our own but other faith communities' histories of times which included more robust staffing, filled worship services, frequent baptisms, and daily programming to name just a few. We feel strongly that the vitality that once was can return not as it was but in a renewed and different capacity as a result of merging.

We know that such conversations are difficult and always come with those so wedded to particular spaces that they are often stifled before they can even begin or by the time it is truly needed it is too late. They, for example, require an honest and open sharing of budgets, worship statistics, and assets. We, however, are seeking to look ahead to the great and glorious things God has yet in store in ministry for us all.

This would be a lay led process employing a transition team curated from participating faith communities who would work with the retained consultant to create a plan and corresponding timeline. We know that these conversations and the potential change raise anxiety. Please surround this with prayer as we seek not to look at endings, but new beginnings as we are a people of resurrection faith.

On behalf of the Finance Team, I wish to give you an update regarding our progress year to date. As of the end of August our expenditures are approximately \$5,000 under budget. All our committee chairs have been careful to keep their spending in line with the Church's needs and the budget for the functions they are responsible for. The collections we have received from our members appear to be below budget, however we know that some of our members give more of their pledges close to the end of the year.

I fully expect that we will end the year on budget. I wish to thank our members for the support they continue to provide to our mission and our church. Our members live our values and allow us to fully care for our ministry.

As we reach the latter part of the calendar year I want to give you a couple of suggestions. Several months ago, when I updated my personal will I included monies for Christ United Methodist Church. Each of you may wish to discuss how you may wish to recognize our church in the longer term.
