CREATION CARE

As we head into Fall here are a couple of ideas to keep in mind:

Avoid the lure of a Leaf-Blower as it uses up valuable natural resources whether gas-powered or electric; raking is much better exercise besides!

Never use your hose to clean your driveway or sidewalks of debris as it allows not just the debris to enter the storm sewers but also any organic waste and pollutants which then enter directly into our lakes, rivers and streams.

Consider planting a tree in your backyard if you have space or have trees planted in Honor/Memory of a Loved One.

The Arbor Day Foundation will plant trees at very reasonable prices and give you options as to how many trees and where they should be planted. You will receive a Commemorative Certificate to present to the recipient. Access their site for more information.

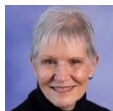

Choral Evensong and Organ Concert

All are invited to an organ concert and service of choral evensong beginning at 3:30 on Sunday, October 11th.

At 3:30, Kevin Durkin will present *Rubrics* by Dan Locklair in its entirety. From the composer:

"**Rubrics (A Liturgical Suite for Organ)** was a 1988 commission from the Organ Artists Series of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, for their tenth anniversary year celebration. The extra-musical impetus and subsequent titles for each movement of *Rubrics* are found in the instructions (rubrics) to the services for **The Book of Common Prayer** (September 1979 edition). *Rubrics* was given its World Premiere in Pittsburgh on 16 April 1989 by organist, Mary Preston.

Peter Hardwick, writing in *The Diapason*, has called **Rubrics** "one of the most frequently played organ works by an American composer." Movements from **Rubrics** were not only heard at the Washington National Cathedral funeral service of President Ronald Reagan in 2004, but also as a part of the January 2009 Martin Luther King Jr. service in the same venue during the Presidential Inauguration of President Barack Obama."

At 4PM, the choir of Christ Church will be joined by the choir of Williamsville UMC to present a service of choral evensong. Rooted in ancient monastic offices of vespers and compline, choral evensong has been a staple of English-language worship since the sixteenth century. With scripture readings, canticles, and anthem, the brief service is much-loved around the world. To see the order of worship, consult page 876 in the hymnal. Free crayons are sent to kids in hospitals all over the country. Studies show that art therapy can reduce heart rates, improve cognition, release endorphins and alleviate stress. And most young patients take the crayons home with them as the happiest part of their stay.

Stitching Hope: Why We Are Crafting Comfort Teddy Bears



In a world that often moves too fast, a simple, soft anchor can make all the difference. While they might look like simple toys, these bears are actually powerful tools of emotional support, designed to bring warmth, safety, and solace to those who need it most.

A Buffer for Stress: Clinical studies show that holding a soft object can significantly lower anxiety, reduce cortisol levels, and offer a sense of security during times of crisis, grief, or transition.

Universal Comfort: A recent survey by Build-A-Bear revealed that 92% of adults still own a childhood stuffed animal, proving that the need for tangible comfort never truly leaves us.

A Silent Confidant: For individuals processing trauma, a teddy bear provides a non-judgmental, silent listener when words are too difficult to speak aloud.

"Teddy bears provide a bridge between dependence and independence. They help individuals self-soothe during moments of stress, grief, or anxiety."

FINANCE CHARIMAN

On behalf of your Finance Committee we want to bring you up to date with your church's finances with one half of the year completed. We are slightly ahead of budget on the contributions side by approximately \$2,200. All department chairs and our Trustees have worked hard to keep the ytd expenses almost \$9,000 under budget. One of our largest concerns is our utilities for which we have no control over the rates charged us. Close monitoring continues in order to be sure we are not consuming more of any of our utilities than is absolutely necessary. The investments that have been made through the Finance Committee investment account and the Endowment Committee's account are generally performing well and are monitored by the respective responsible committee.

As a church we have done well with our second Sunday mission efforts. Those contributions are not reflected in the financial report above because whatever is given is quickly given to the charitable organization utilizing the funds.

Please do your best to meet your annual giving to the church. While we are slightly ahead of plan, we frequently fall behind our plan in the latter part of the year.

Please keep Christ Church in mind as you decide how your 529 funds from this year are used. Direct contributions to our church through 529 gifts can improve your tax burden for 2026.

2nd Sunday 2nd Helping Offering

September 2026: Little Free Food Pantry

The September 2026 2nd Helping Offering will support the Little Free Food Pantry hosted at CUMC. This pantry is located on our grounds and all are welcome to use it. It sees a great deal of use and we replenish it using canned and dry good donations from the congregation. This cash offering will allow the outreach team to purchase additional food items to ensure the pantry remains fully stocked.

October: Durham Maternal Stress-Free Zone. The Durham Memorial AME Zion Church hosts the Maternal Stress-Free Zone offers comfortable space and knowledgeable support for pregnant and breastfeeding mothers and their babies and families, as well as to raise public and community awareness on issues of health, wellness, safety and nutrition through the provision of meals and workshops, maintenance of a community garden, and other community projects and, in doing so, minimize maternal stress. Our 2nd Helping offering will help support this program, including the purchase of formula needed for families to feed their children.

November 2026: Veterans One Stop: In honor of Veteran's Day, the 2nd Sunday Offering for November will go to the Veterans One Stop Center, which brings people, resources and organizations together to improve the quality of life for those who have served or are serving in the Armed Forces of the United States and their families. Veterans One Stop believes that all Veterans and their families have barrier-free access to the services they need to deal with challenges at home, to complete the transition to civilian life, and to achieve their goals and reach their full potential.

December 2026: Good Neighbors Medical and Dental Care: Good Neighbors Health Care provides free Medical & Dental services to adults who are uninsured or under-insured and do not have access to medical or dental care. Good Neighbors is operated by medical & dental providers and students who volunteer their time in service to the community. Education and Outreach Services are provided by Harvest House staff, social workers, and care linkage specialists. This service is meant for individuals who have no other option for medical or dental care.

On August 10, a powerful earthquake struck Choco, Columbia. UMCOR immediately mobilized to assess needs on the ground and coordinate with partners already present in Colombia, so that relief - food, clean water, medical care, and shelter – reaches those who need it most. Even as the full scope of the damage is still coming into focus, that presence matters: a sign that no community grieves alone.

In 2025, UMCOR responded to 115 humanitarian crises worldwide including 30 floods, 11 tropical storms, 6 tornadoes, 29 migration events, 7 events of mass violence/civil unrest and 5 fires, aiding approximately 267,976 people.
